

## Assessing the Sustainability Impacts of Forest Management in Northern Europe – a Scottish Perspective



A seminar organised by the Northern ToSIA project

This is the second of three international seminars to be organised as part of **Northern ToSIA**, a project funded by the EU Northern Periphery Programme. The project is developing new ways to assess the sustainability of forest based activities in Northern Europe. The results of the project will help managers to balance the demands of different aspects of forestry, for example timber production, wildlife and recreation.

The Cairngorms National Park has been selected as a case study for the project. Three other case studies are being carried out: in Finland (North Karelia), Sweden (Malå Sami Village) and Norway (Indre Helgeland).

### ONE-DAY CONFERENCE

A public event organised for all those who have a role in forestry and land-use planning, particularly within the Cairngorms National Park, but also in similar regions in Scotland and Northern Europe.

The conference will:

- Highlight the need for comprehensive monitoring tools for forestry and land use planning within and beyond the Cairngorms National Park.
- Introduce delegates to 'ToSIA' (Tool for Sustainability Impact Assessment), and discuss its application in the four case study areas.
- Include a practical discussion of the possible sustainability impacts of altering land use under different scenarios in the Cairngorms National Park, and how these impacts could be assessed.
- Provide an opportunity to meet with partners from other northern European countries and contribute to the development of the project.

## HOW TO GET THERE



### **By Road: From North (Inverness)**

Leave A9 as signposted for Aviemore (B970), turn right at T junction and follow road through Aviemore village. Turn right (2nd exit) at first roundabout into the Macdonald Aviemore Highland Resort and follow signs to Reception.

### **From South (Glasgow, Edinburgh and Perth)**

Leave A9 as signposted for Aviemore (B970), turn left at T junction and follow road into Aviemore village. Immediately after Esso garage on right, turn left into Macdonald Aviemore Highland Resort. (first exit on completion of roundabout at this junction) and follow signs to Reception

### **From Aberdeen:**

Join (A96) heading north west to Moay for 80 miles. Join the (A95) heading south west towards Aviemore for 75 miles. Turn left onto the A9 for 4 miles. Leave A9 as signposted for Aviemore (B970), turn right at T junction and follow road through Aviemore village. Turn right (2nd exit) at first roundabout into the Macdonald Aviemore Highland Resort and follow signs to Reception.

### **By Bus:**

Terminal 200metres away from resort. (coaches from London (12 hrs) Edinburgh 2 1/2 hrs) & Glasgow 3 hrs).

### **By Rail:**

From Edinburgh airport, take a 20-minute taxi journey or a 30-minute #100 Airport bus journey direct to Edinburgh Waverley train station. From Waverley station, take a train to Aviemore which will take approximately 3 hours.

The Aviemore station is just 200 metres away from the Macdonald resort with direct services from London Kings Cross, Edinburgh, Glasgow etc
