<p><b>Talk about some everyday needs and things that are made to meet these</b></p> <p><b>Name some familiar products, say what they are for and what they are made from</b></p> <p><b>Talk about how familiar items, including those that they make themselves, are made through a sequence of steps</b></p>	<p>To understand that trees are plants and that they are the source of different types of wood used to make many everyday objects</p> <p>To know the names of a few different types of trees/woods</p> <p>To know that trees can have broad leaves with veins e.g. Oak, or thin sharp needles e.g. Fir</p> <p>To be able to identify things that are made from wood</p> <p>To know at a simple level the process that takes place from seed - fully grown tree - harvesting and felling - through to producing useful products</p>	<p>Make a display of things that come from wood and discuss - What do they think wood is? Where does it come from? What do we use it for?
