Something for everyone

The Forestry Commission welcomes walkers, cyclists and horse riders to use any of the forest trails. Horse riders will need a permit, which is available from the District Office.

There is an extensive network of paths through the forest, but it is suggested that new visitors stick to the Forest of Bere Trail, as it is easy to get lost in such a large area!

There is also a trail from Upperford Copse that joins the Meon Valley Railway Line, a disused line now open to walkers, cyclists and horse riders.

In the North Boarhunt side of the forest, there is the Ancient Oak Trail, which can be accessed from West Walk car park. Take care crossing Hundred Acres Road and wear appropriate footwear, as this trail is not surfaced.

We ask that visitors do not use their own barbecues and note that disposable barbecues are prohibited. We provide a bookable barbecue – contact the District Office for details.

There are three car parks available for visitors, all of which have a pay and display machine. Annual parking permits are available from the District Office. The car parks are locked at night, so please check closing times at the entrance as these change with the season. West Walk Car Park has toilet facilities, including toilets for disabled visitors. There are also play areas for children of different ages.
