<p><b>Nigel Ajax-Lewis MBE</b></p>	<p>I am the Senior Conservation Officer - Wildlife Trust for South &amp; West Wales, where I have particular responsibilities for biodiversity issues concerning the whole Trust. I have held the post of Conservation Manager for Berkshire, Buckinghamshire and Oxfordshire Naturalist Trust. Also a similar post with Gwent County Council. I am a past Chairman of the British Association for Nature Conservationists. I received an MBE for service to nature conservation in South &amp; West Wales in June 2005.</p>
<p><b>Roger Cooper Chairman</b></p>	<p>I have worked in the forestry sector for 40 years. I started my career in New Zealand where I worked as an economist for the New Zealand Forest Service. In 1972 I moved to the School of Agricultural and Forest Sciences at the University of Wales, Bangor where I worked until I retired in 2004. I was Head of School from 1997-2004. My teaching and research interests include forest products marketing and economics, international trade in forest products and UK and European forest policy. In 2005 I co-ordinated the establishment of the Leadership Group of the Wales Forest Business Partnership and currently serve as a member. I chair the Interpretation Panel of UKWAS.</p>
<p><b>Oliver Combe</b></p>	<p>I work for BSW Timber as a "purchasing and supply manager" this involves purchasing over 300,000 tonnes per year of sawlogs for BSW's two sawmills in Wales at Newbridge on Wye and Senghenydd, I also co-ordinate co-products sales for the two sawmills to a variety of markets. I am a member of the FC/Private woodlands liaison committee. I have worked for BSW for 10 years having started as a management trainee, prior to this I worked for as a forestry and harvesting contractor for BSW harvesting / Shotton forest management and then managed a Christmas tree farm. I have an HND in Forestry and a degree in Geography. I have particular interests in commercial timber production, Silviculture, wildlife management and Christmas tree production. I am a keen advocate of the role of commercial conifer forestry in sustainable development.</p>

<b>Kath McNulty</b>	I am currently ConFor's National Manager for Wales. I previously worked for Forestry Commission Wales advising on community engagement and managing a project restoring ancient woodland. I am passionate about quality home grown timber and the increasing role forestry needs to play in a world rapidly running out of oil.
<b>Hilary Miller</b>	My current role is Senior Land Use Policy Officer - Countryside Council for Wales. In my work with CCW I have maintained an active role in wider rural land use issues, including agriculture and rural development and I believe that woodland and forestry still needs to be better integrated with other land management. I have experience in producing policy documents, commissioning and managing research projects, analysing problems, seeking solutions and providing practical advice.
