To keep our woodlands a safe, healthy and enjoyable place for you and your dog, please:

- Always keep your dog in sight & under control; use a lead if need be.
- Never let you dog chase wildlife or farm animals; it causes serious injuries and your dog could become lost, hit by a car or shot.
- Keep your dog at your side when passing other woodland visitors; always ask before letting your pet approach other people or their dogs.
- Respect request to keep your dog on the path or away from some areas; this helps protect young animals and birds at sensitive times.
- Worm your dog regularly and keep its vaccinations up-to-date.
- Never leave poo where people walk. Bag it AND put it in a bin on site or at home. Use a stick to flick poo off the path in remote areas.
- Ensure your dog always wears a collar with your name, address and mobile phone number.
