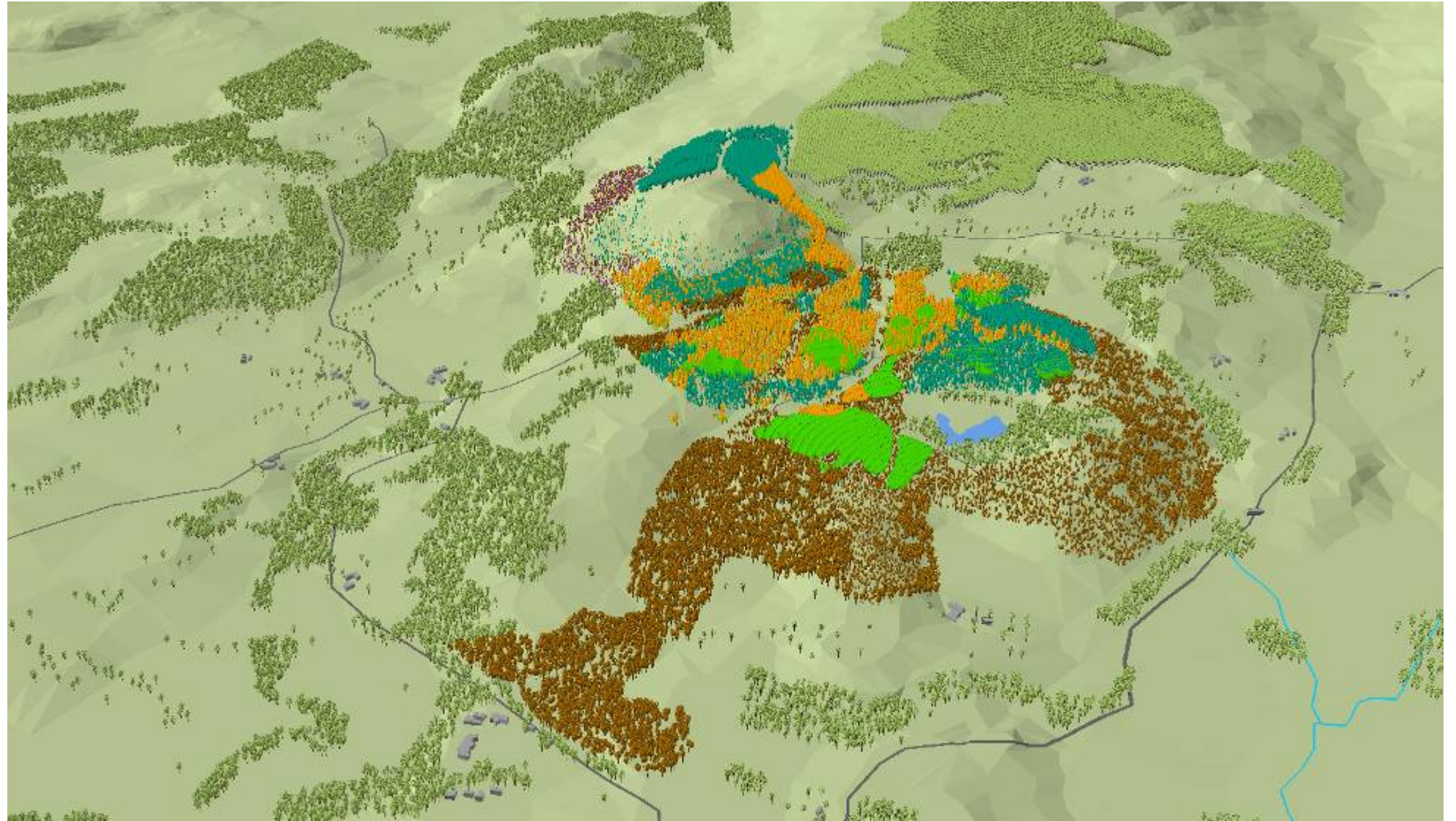
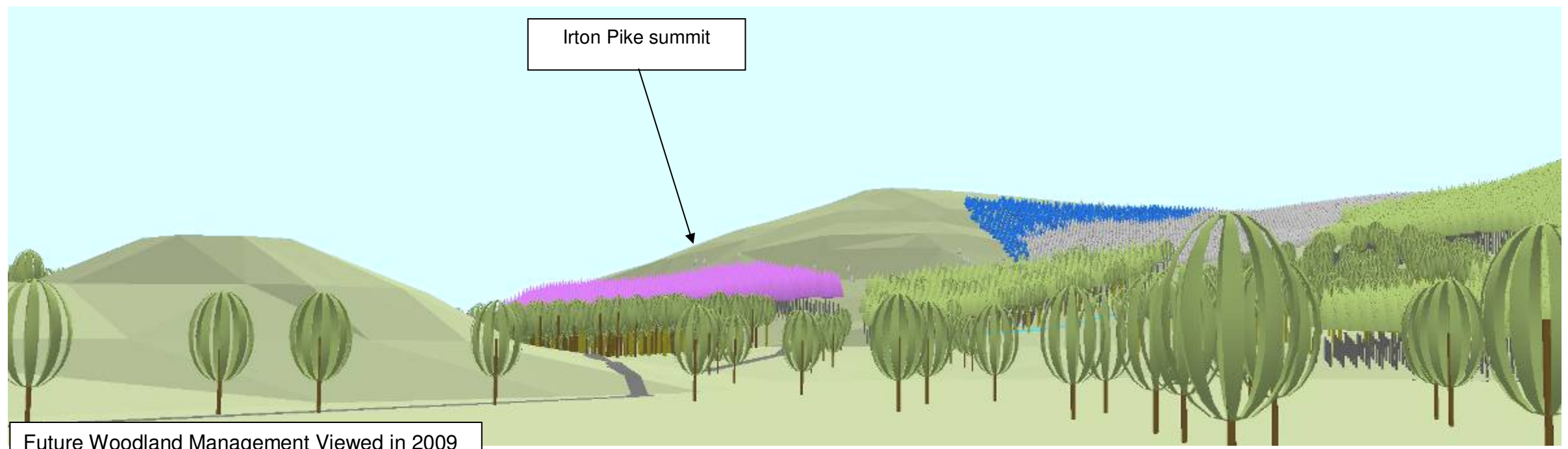


Parkgate & Irton Forest Design Plan Spring 2009 Review – Computer Perspectives



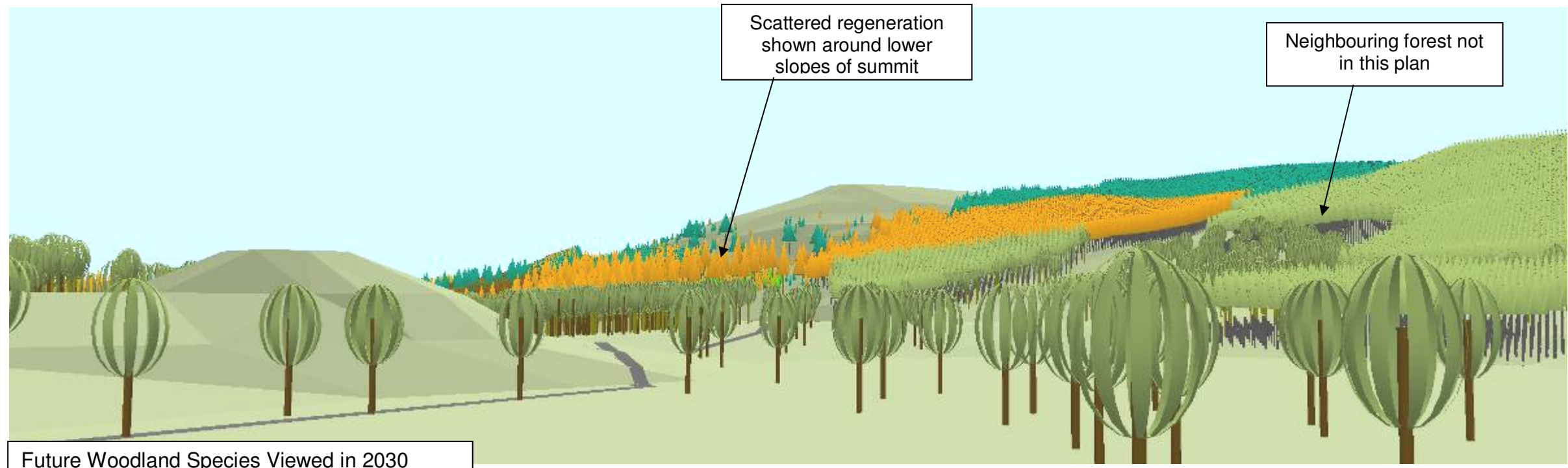

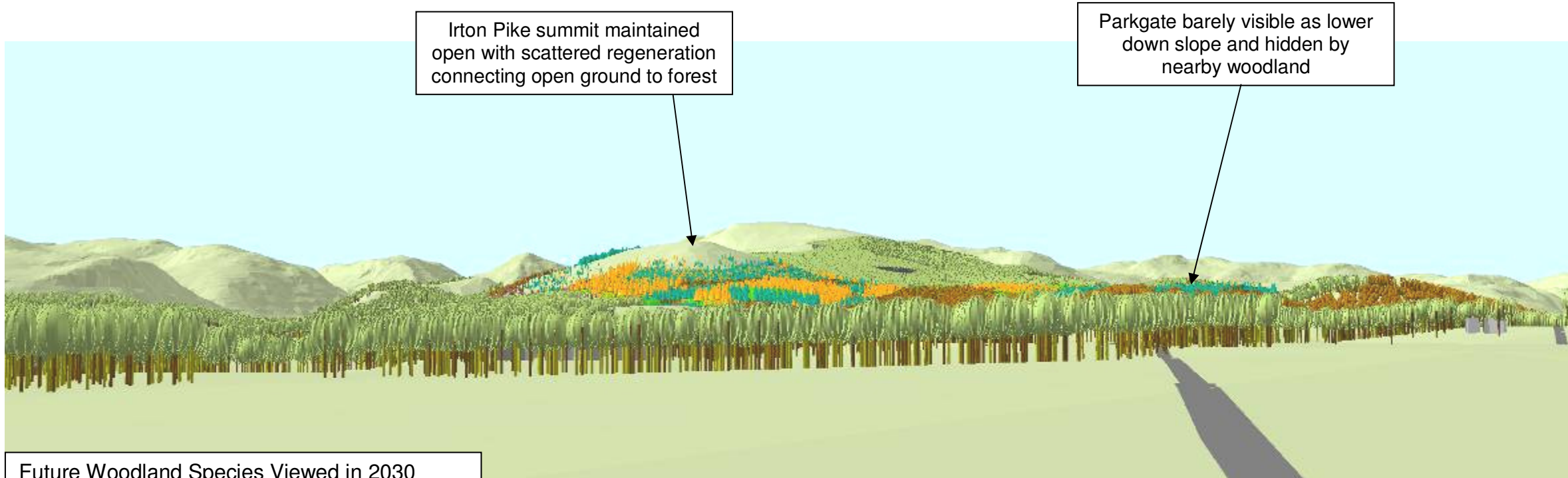

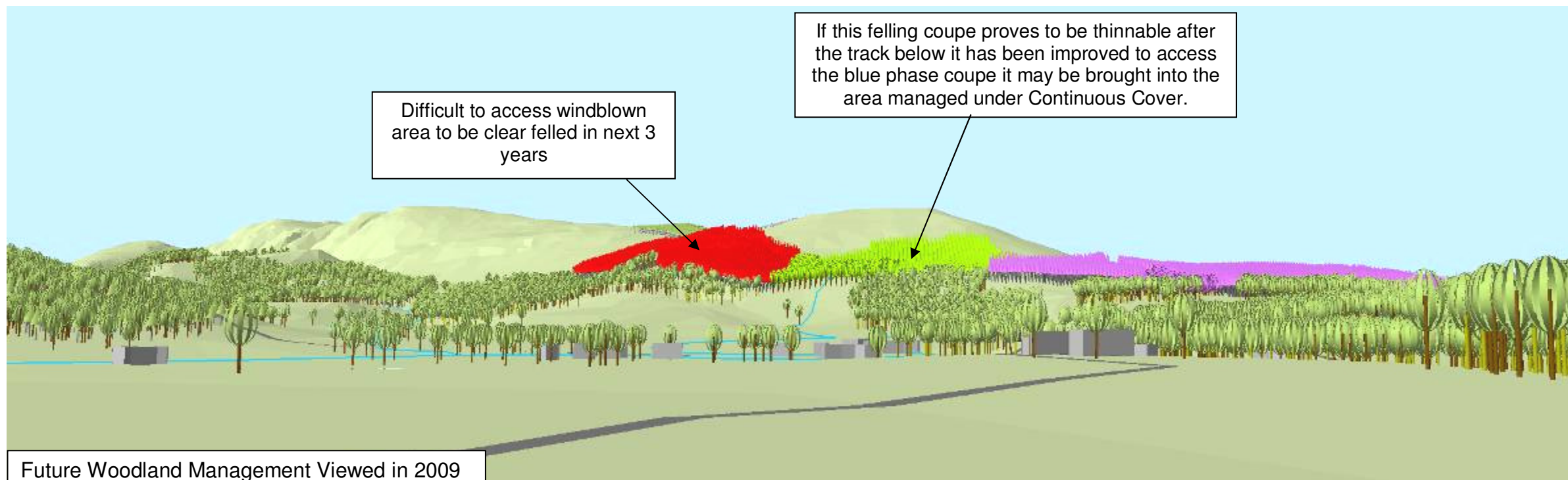
Future Woodland Species Viewed in 2030

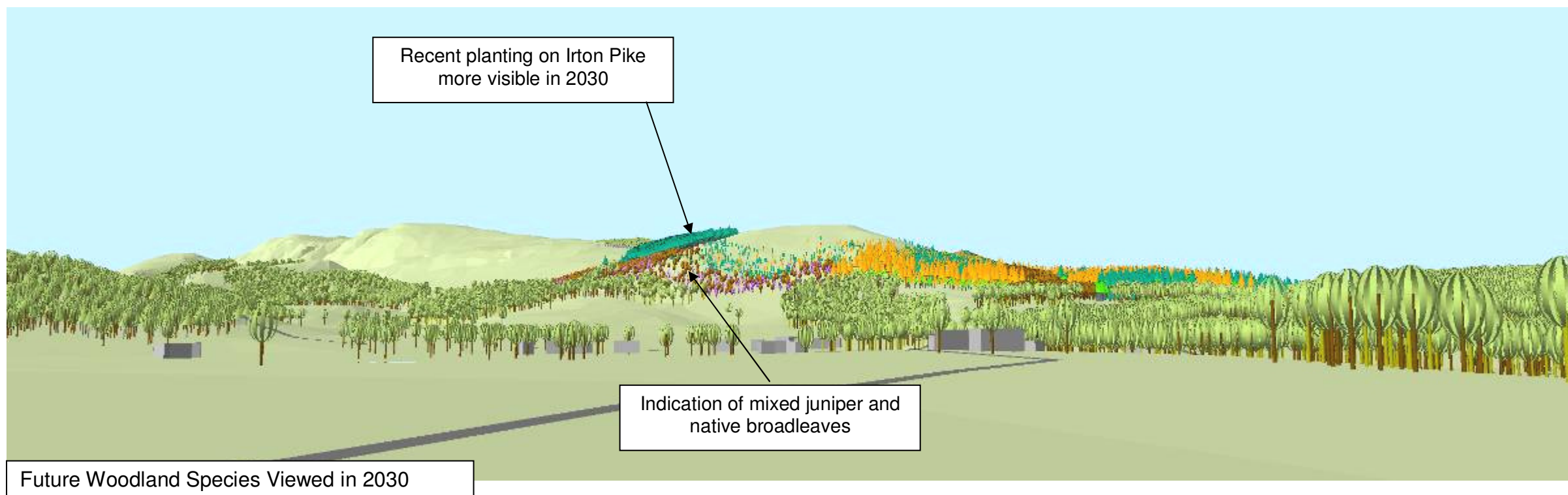

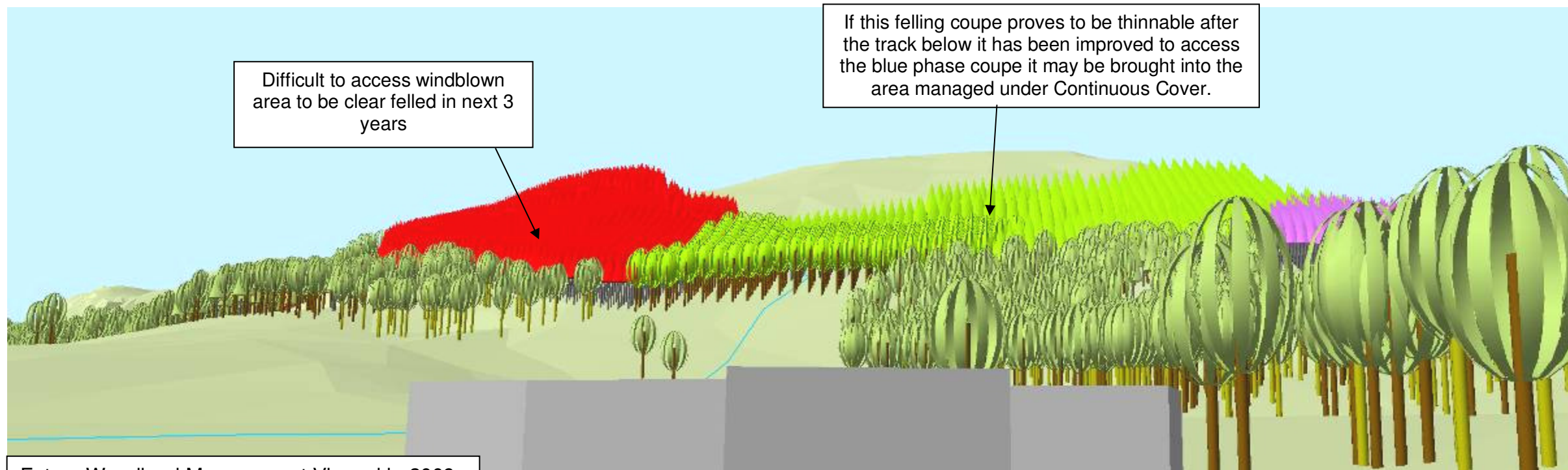

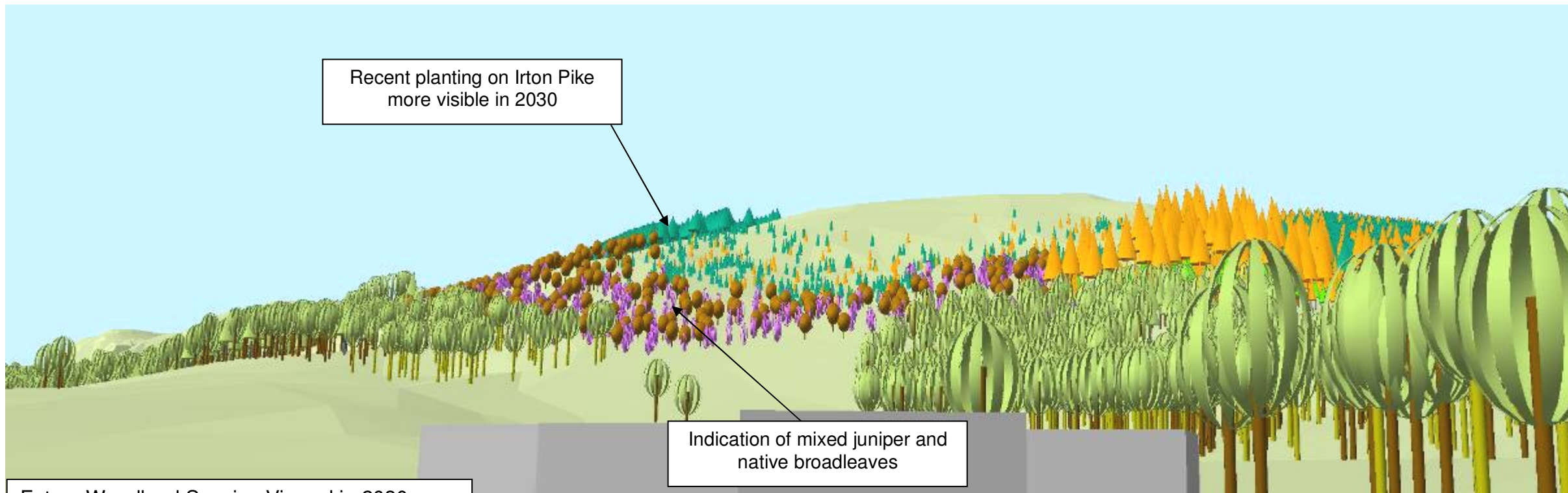


Difficult to access windblown area to be clear felled in next 3 years

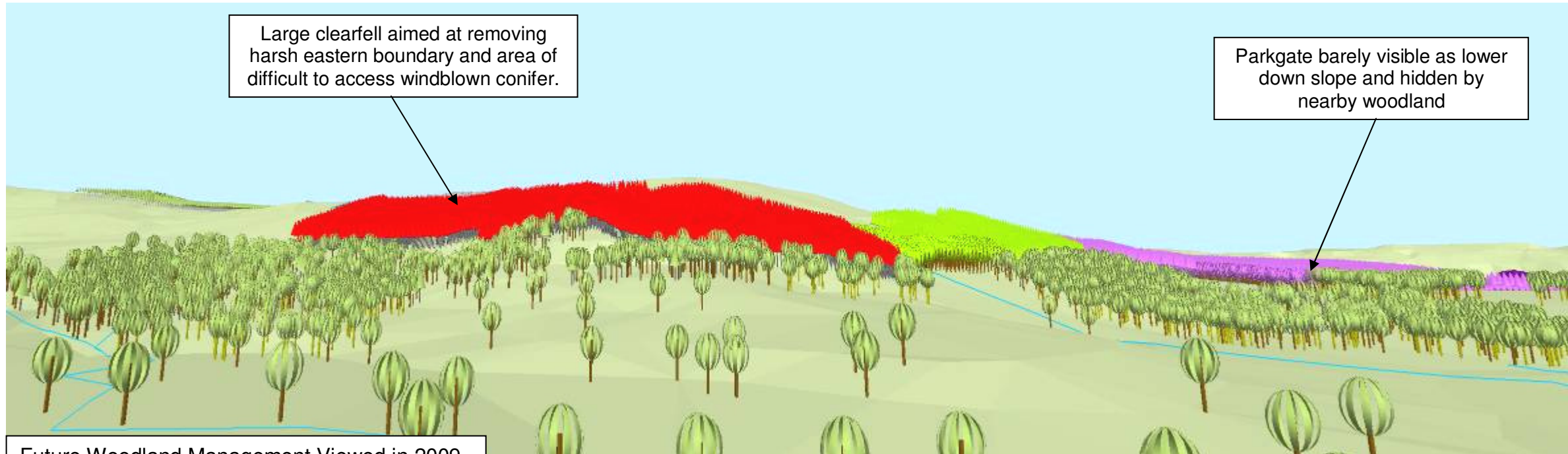

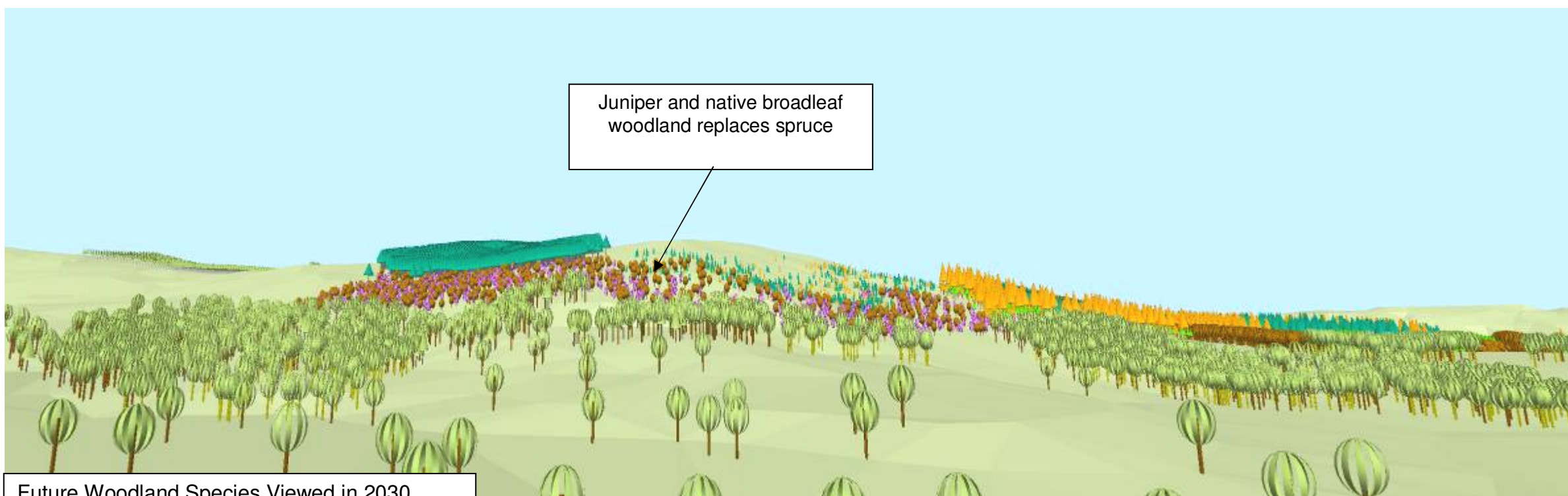

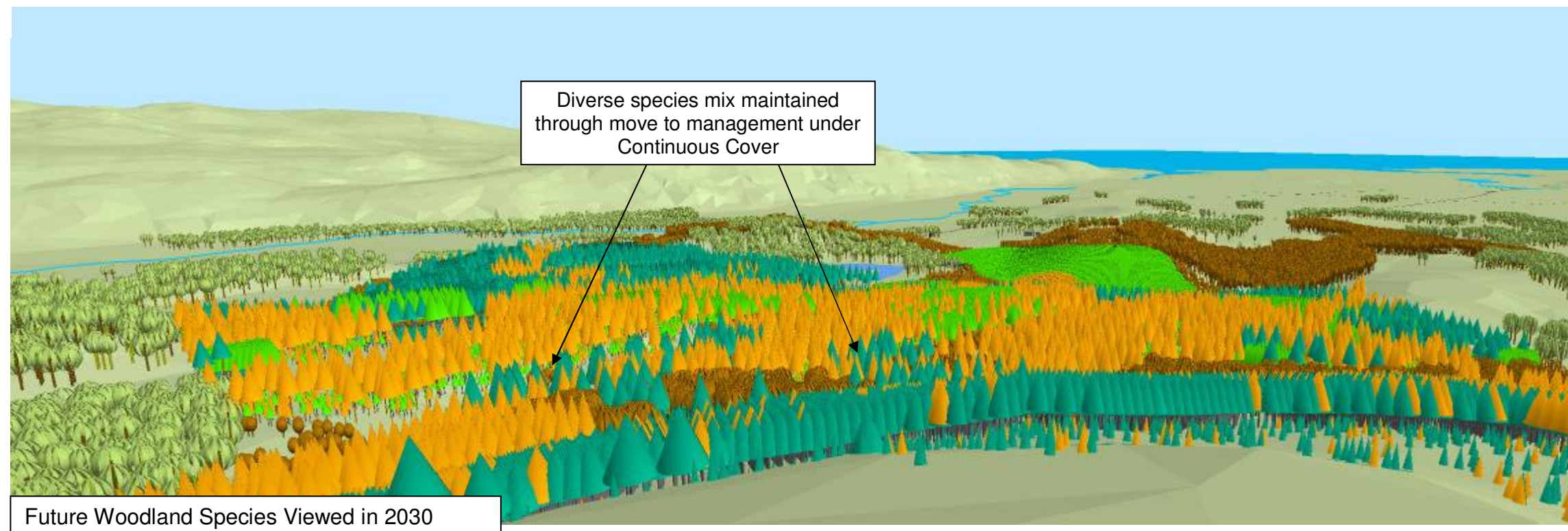
