This 550 acre woodland offers plenty to interest visitors of all ages. You can walk the quiet woodland trails, which includes an 'all-abilities' route. Look for wildlife and clues to Haughmond's colourful history along the way.

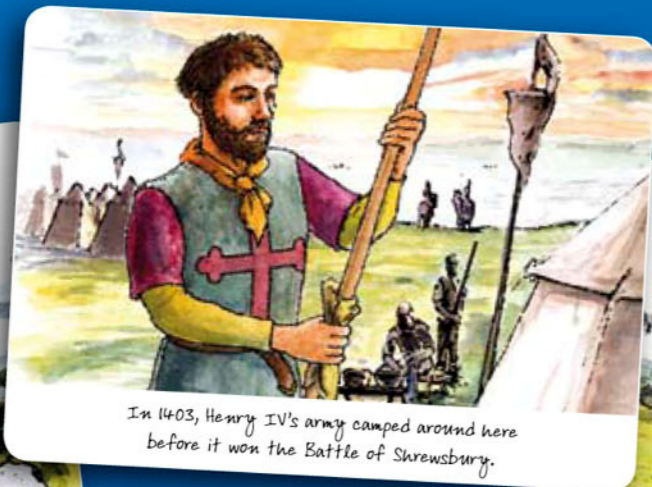

VISITORS FROM THE PAST...

Haughmond has been a focal point for generations...

Ancient ramparts on the edge of the escarpment are all that is left to show that Iron Age people once used the landmark as a trading centre.



In 1403, Henry IV's army camped around here before it won the Battle of Shrewsbury.

Haughmond Hill was a popular beauty spot with Victorian families who used to flock here on Sundays to walk and picnic.
