- Need framework for setting targets and aspirations which marry national/top down with local bottom up
- Target setting needs to incorporate outcomes, not just woodland area, type etc
- Agreed targets need to lead to woodland which is sustainable
- Need large scale 'wild' open forest areas, but integrate with open ground landuse/habitat
