THE MEETING

The aims of this meeting are to report on the latest research findings and other actions for Priority Species associated with woodland in the UK, to identify existing knowledge gaps, and to set priorities for future research and other actions to ensure progress towards meeting UKBAP targets.

It is expected that Lead Partners, key researchers, and practitioners concerned with management to meet the needs of Priority Species in woodlands, will attend. The meeting will feature presentations and posters of the latest research findings on a wide range of Priority Species, in an informal gathering that will provide opportunities for the exchange of ideas and lively debate.

THE VENUE

Stamford Hall, built in 1907, is surrounded by beautiful gardens, and with en-suite and standard accommodation, dining facilities and car parking all close by, this hall is ideal as a self-contained venue for the meeting.

Located just off the A6, in Oadby, to the SE of City centre, Stamford Hall is reached easily by car or public transport.
