
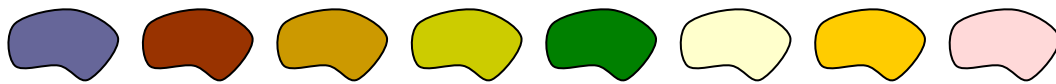


Art scavenger hunt

3. Something that matches these colours



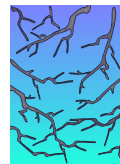
4. A shadow picture

8. Furry moss

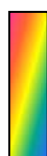


9. A hard nut
