

Bramble in woodland – bane or benefit

Wednesday 21st June 2006

Background

Bramble is a widely distributed native species that occurs within the ground flora of many woodland communities. Foresters often regard the species as a problem weed that can cause significant difficulties for tree establishment, but it is important for wildlife providing nectar, berries and habitat . . . This one day meeting aims to bring together both forest managers and ecologists to discuss the role of bramble in woodland. It will comprise a series of short talks in the morning and an afternoon field visit.

This meeting is being organised by Forest Research and hosted by Forest Enterprise on the behalf of the Forest Ecology Group of the British Ecological Society
