

Site Rules

Tackeroo is a quiet family focused recreational site. To ensure that everyone enjoys their stay visitors are asked to abide by the following rules:

Fees

- Fees are £10 per pitch per night.
- A Ranger will call to collect payment.
- Fees during concert weekend (10th July – 13th July 2015) will increase to £20 per pitch per night.

Safety and security

- Please display your ticket clearly at all times.
- Please ensure that the main gate is kept closed at all times.
- Please adhere to the 10mph speed limit for all vehicles.
- All vehicles must remain within the caravan site and are NOT to enter the wider forest area.
- NO OPEN FIRES, FIRE PITS OR CHIMINERAS and no BBQs on wooden benches or on any grassed areas.
- All gas cylinders must be stored securely and safely at all times.
- Please do not erect washing lines, gazebos or other structures without express permission from the Forestry Commission.
- No persons under the age of 16 should be left on site without the supervision of an adult. Parents are responsible for the behaviour and safety of their children.
- Cannock Chase Forest is a working forest, please pay careful attention to all safety signage.

Enjoyment

- Please be considerate and respect other visitors using the site.
- No noise between 10pm and 8am.
- Generators are not to be run for more than 2 hours at a time and not between 10pm and 8am.
- A maximum of 14 day permitted stay in any one pitch and a total maximum of 28 days permitted stay on site.

Wildlife and Environmental Protection

- Dogs are welcome on site but must be kept under close control or on leads at all times and are not allowed to wander free.
- Please clean up after your dog.
- Leave no litter – use bins provided.
- Please only use the Sanilav disposal points for all waste and grey water.
- Please do not cut vegetation, trees or collect firewood as deadwood forms an important habitat.
- Follow the forest code – leave nothing behind and take nothing away.

The Forestry Commission reserve the right to ask people to leave the site if rules are not adhered to, no refunds will be paid. The Forestry Commission will have the final decision on any disagreement relating to health and safety or site rules and will not accept responsibility for any damage or loss of property.
