The disease ash dieback is affecting woodland in Britain. The disease is not harmful to people or animals, but it can kill ash trees.

The main symptoms are:

- dead branches
- blackening of leaves which often hang on the tree
- discoloured stems often in a diamond-shape where a leaf was attached.
