The Forestry Commission provide placements for individuals with an interest in pursuing a career in conservation, community engagement, recreation, site management, working with volunteers and the public and wanting to gain experience in the sector. Successful applicants will be given training and development opportunities by work shadowing current countryside staff.

They will shadow and develop on the job skills and experience including practical site management (habitat creation and restoration), working with communities (project development and implementation), supporting community interest groups and managing public expectation, planning and undertaking countryside events, and environmental education.

Unfortunately at the present time we **cannot** offer travel expenses however we do provide extensive experience and some formal training opportunities.

Experience, encourage and support active community involvement on countryside sites within the Doncaster & Barnsley area; through community engagement, consultation, practical projects and events. Learn how to involve local people in the decision making and management of their local environment.

Working as part of the Community Ranger team assist, support and help empower local communities to become actively involved in the care and management of urban fringe woodlands & countryside sites in South Yorkshire.

Assist and provide support to a diverse range of people, experiencing the range of tasks, activities and procedures that rangers undertake within their role.

This post may require you to hold and continue to hold, a full current driving licence. Duties will require you to be fit and able to negotiate rough terrain. However, the Forestry Commission is willing to consider any proposal put forward by applicants that would allow them to do the job by other means.
