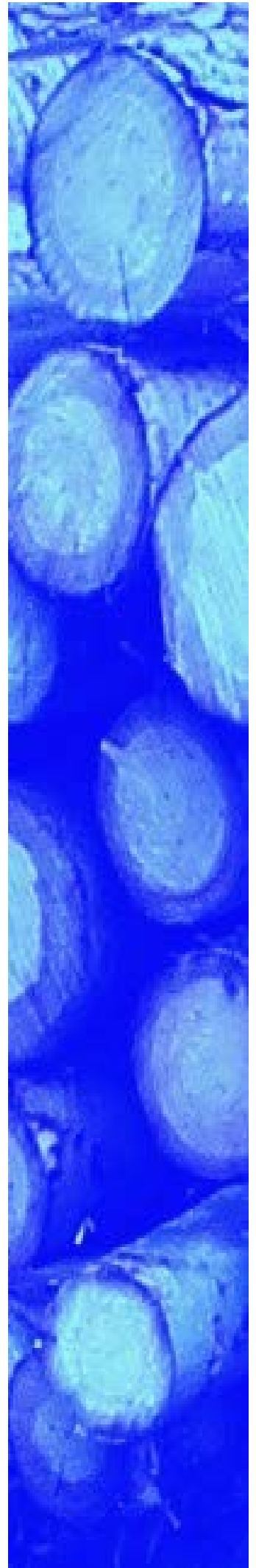

## TENDERS

### GENERAL CONDITIONS OF SALE

1. The Forestry Commission Electronic Sales System (e-sales) is the only way of submitting a Tender offer. To register for e-sales please go to the webpage <http://www.esales.eforestry.gov.uk/EndUser/login/login.jsp> or contact Charene Winbow at the address below.

2. All tender offers must be submitted through the e-sales system by 12.30 on 02 July 2015. Tenders cannot be submitted into e-sales after this time. It is the responsibility of the Tenderer to ensure that their tender offers have been submitted before the Tender closes to bids.

Please note checks are made by the Forestry Commission during the registration process and you should allow plenty of time for these checks to be made.

3. The sale of the Lots offered at this tender is subject to the conditions in this tender catalogue and the Lots sold will be the subject of a separate Standard Contract and Conditions of Sale, specimens of which may be obtained from the Operations Team at the address below, and which will be available for scrutiny at Forest District Offices listed on Pages 5.

4. The Tenderer shall be deemed to have acquainted himself with the terms and conditions of the sale before making his offer. It should be noted that the amount offered is to be shown as either a lump sum, a price per m<sup>3</sup> underbark, or a price per tonne, whichever is applicable as detailed on the Tender schedule. Successful purchasers will be responsible for payment of any weighbridge fees concerned.

5. All bids shall be exclusive of Value Added Tax, which shall be added to the purchase price of each Lot at the appropriate rate.

6. The description of the trees in the Sale Catalogue is believed to be accurate but is not guaranteed. In all other respects the Tenderer is held as satisfying himself as to the description of the Sale Lots.

7. No Lot carries entitlement to the offer of continuity of supplies of timber outside the Terms and Conditions of the Contract.

8. The Seller reserves the right to withdraw Lots at any time.

9. The operative dates and instalment dates of Standing Sales Agreements are as stated. The dates of commencement and of completion of Log contracts will be as indicated against each Lot in the catalogue.

10. Where a Purchaser buys more than one Lot the Purchaser or the Seller may request that the timing of the commencement and completion of one or more of the contracts be rescheduled. This will be at the sole discretion of the Seller but agreement will not be unreasonably withheld.

11. Payment conditions are as stated in the Sale Contract referred to in 3 above. The Purchaser's attention is drawn to the clause in the specimen contracts which describes the normal terms of trading. Application of these terms, which is at the sole discretion of the Seller, is subject to establishment of satisfactory credit-worthiness.

12. The Seller's normal terms of payment for credit sales of felled logs are that 'payment shall be made not later than the end of the calendar month following the month of despatch', but also see Clause 11 above.

13. A deposit, in accordance with Section 8 of the Standard Contract referred to in 3 above, will be charged on all environmentally sensitive sites as denoted in the tender catalogue.

14. Arrangements to inspect the Lots should be made direct with the Forest District concerned. An address list is given on page 5. Purchasers will be deemed to have acquainted themselves with arrangements for access, special conditions and constraints, if any, in respect of each Lot prior to tendering, details of which are available from the Forest District staff. Purchasers will be bound by these special conditions.

15. There is a presumption that the contracts will commence on the dates stated and Time will be the essence of the contracts...

16. Where a Purchaser buys a number of Lots, the Seller may amalgamate them into as few contracts as is appropriate in order to reduce transaction costs.

17. Blue Stain – To minimise the spread of blue stain in pine logs prior to collection the Seller undertakes to bring fresh felled produce to the point of sale within 4 weeks of felling. In view of this undertaking and recognising that there is a possibility of blue stain developing at almost any time of the year, the Seller is not prepared to accept as a defect or to entertain claims in respect of blue stain.

18. An agreed weight/volume conversion factor based upon sample loads will be applied to weighed loads. Purchasers will be responsible for payment of the weighbridge fees concerned.

19. Cross-cutting Charge – Sawlogs are offered as random lengths within the range specified against each Lot in the catalogue. A charge may be made to recover the additional costs incurred in meeting purchasers' requests for cutting to their specified lengths, as explained in the Forestry Commission publication 'Classification and Presentation of Softwood Sawlogs'.

20. Safety signs, conforming to British Standard BS5378, which warn individuals of a hazard and/or prohibit entry are to be provided and maintained to the satisfaction of the Seller.

21. Chainsaw operators working on the seller's land must have attained the Certificates of Competence issued by the National Proficiency Tests Council (NPTC) or the *new* equivalent Awards offered by LANTRA, covering all the work they will undertake for this contract. All chainsaw operators must also meet the Forest Industry Safety Accord (FISA) requirements for periodic refresher training. NPTC trainees who need to consolidate their skills prior to their formal NPTC assessment will be allowed to operate chainsaws on FC land only if they possess a valid Record of Training and Achievement. For the purposes of this condition a valid Record of Training and Achievement is one issued after November 1993 and which is still current. These are now issued by FISA. The Purchaser will be responsible for ensuring trainees undergoing consolidation of training and other young chainsaw users are supervised in accordance with the sections covering New Workers and Young Workers in the Health and Safety Executive's Leaflet INDG317(rev2) "Chainsaws at Work".

**22. Standing Sales with Reserved Timber Element (RTE)**  
**These conditions apply to Lots 1.09- 1.13- Yorkshire Forest District**

The Seller offers the above Lots on a price per tonne basis with the retention of ownership of a quantity of timber to the specification as detailed in the Contract schedule, delivered to and stacked at specified / agreed points at forest roadside. The quantity thus retained is detailed under the lot description in the catalogue.

*Example of Sales with Reserved Timber Element (RTE)*

*Lot x is a 4500t standing sale with 500t of timber reserved.*

*Purchaser is actually buying 4000t of the total quantity on site, yet the price per tonne for that timber will include the harvesting and extraction to roadside of the 500t of reserved timber.*

*N.B. A single price per tonne is required for the Lot.*

Tenderers for this lot are advised to contact the District Forester at Yorkshire FD (contact details on page 5) to discuss the requirements and see a worked example before bidding.

23. **All contracts will carry a requirement that machine operators undertaking operations included within the scope of the Forest Machine Operator Certification Scheme are required to have successfully completed the relevant assessments. Trainees will be accepted subject to agreement and must be registered with the Scheme. This will include renegotiated period or long-term contracts.**

24. The Seller is committed to the guidance contained in 'Road Haulage of Round Timber Code of Practice (4th Edition)'. Our policy on this is on page 4. Checks on compliance with the code will be made and appropriate action taken if non-compliance is discovered.

25. If Tenderers do not wish to purchase more than a given quantity then that quantity should be specified as a condition to the offer made, however please note that Lots will not be split. The selection of Lots to be sold to the Purchaser within the stated quantity will be at the discretion of the Seller.

26. The Seller shall not be bound to accept the highest or any tender offer, and shall be entitled to accept a tender offer as a whole or only in respect of one Lot or a number of Lots within the tender offer

27. All timber on offer in this sale is covered by the certification code **SGS-FM/COC-010297** issued under the QUALIFOR Programme by SGS Qualifor.

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## BIOSECURITY

Following significant outbreaks of tree diseases including Dothistroma disease of pine (Red Band Needle Blight), Ramorum disease of Larch (Phytophthora), Acute Oak Decline, and Chalara disease of ash, the Forestry Commission has issued biosecurity guidelines to support its Tree Health Strategy. Those working in woodlands can help reduce the inadvertent spread of these and other pests and diseases by practicing biosecurity at all times. Please let us know if you observe any potential symptoms of disease or insect pests whilst visiting our woodlands.

In summary we have two biosecurity risk levels – High Risk where a controlled pest or disease is known to be present and Low Risk for everywhere else. There are no Zero Risk areas. We ask anyone inspecting **any** parcel offered for sale by the Forestry Commission to please make themselves familiar with our biosecurity guidelines and observe them. In summary...

### Low Risk

- Avoid driving into the woodland at all if possible. Otherwise please keep road vehicles on metalled, drained roads and knock or brush off any deposits of mud and organic debris around the wheels or bodywork are before leaving any woodland.
- Please brush your footwear clean of soil, mud and organic debris before getting back into a vehicle or leaving the woodland.

### High Risk

- We will make it clear if a parcel has a High Biosecurity Risk when we offer it for sale.
  - You must not visit this site without contacting us first. You will then need to abide by the additional control measures that we will stipulate.
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## **Road Haulage of Round Timber Code of Practice Forestry Commission Policy**

It is the Forestry Commission's policy to comply with all the recommendations contained within the Code of Practice with regard to its own practices and operations and to require a similar level of compliance from all private individuals and companies when they are operating on Forestry Commission land.

The main road network in Forestry Commission forests and woodlands is normally capable of taking fully loaded lorries weighing up to either 40 tonnes on 5-axles or 41 tonnes on 6-axles.

From 1<sup>st</sup> February 2001 revised legislation has been introduced, which, subject to meeting specified criteria, allows an increase in the maximum lorry GVW from 41 tonnes to 44 tonnes. Subject to any road classification and limiting road features Forest Enterprise will recognise the increase on its forest roads.

However, the extension of the increase WILL NOT be automatic and shall be dependent on customers (and their hauliers) providing a written statement that specified rig and trailer combinations fully comply with the new legislation. Please provide this information on an individual contract basis (grouping contracts/hauliers where appropriate) direct to our Territorial office in Bristol for the attention of Charene Winbow. In new contracts this matter will be dealt with through the pre-commencement meetings.

Customers/hauliers who do not supply the above information will be expected to run their fleet restricted to 41 tonne GVW on Forestry Commission roads in line with our current policy. FE will be reviewing its policy with regard to the Road haulage of Round Timber Code of Practice particularly on the subject of overloading.

All hauliers operating on Forestry Commission roads will be advised in advance of restrictions of any sort applying to the particular sections of the network which they are authorised to use.

It is expected of hauliers that all loading of timber will be in accordance with the recommendations of the Code of Practice, and that all loads will be properly secured before a lorry departs from the loading site.

The Code of Practice states that all road vehicles used for timber transportation should either be fitted with a load weighing device or be loaded by a machine so fitted. Forest Enterprise will award timber haulage contracts only to hauliers able to demonstrate that their lorry fleet is able to comply with this recommendation. Similarly the Forestry Commission will expect purchasers of roundwood from its own direct production sites, or of standing sales, and who are responsible for their own haulage arrangements to comply fully with the same recommendation. Exemptions will be granted only in exceptional circumstances, and only following prior agreement with local Forest Enterprise staff.

Enforcement of compliance with the Code of Practice will be through the contracts the Forestry Commission has with its timber customers and hauliers. The existing standard contracts covering purchase of timber allow for immediate termination of a contract if the train weight of any vehicle used by a timber purchaser exceeds the maximum prescribed, or for repeated breaches of any of the other recommendations of the Code of Practice. Future haulage contracts will contain similar provisions.

The Forestry Commission has recently introduced sanctions for overloading and security breaches. Information on how these are applied can be obtained from Charene Winbow at the Bristol address on page 1. Those guilty of serious or repeated breaches of the Code of Practice can expect to have their contracts terminated and, if circumstances justify it, restrictions placed on their future freedom to operate on Forestry Commission land.

### Standing Sales

Lots 1.03-1.05, 1.14, 1.18 and lot 1.25 will be sold on a lump sum basis.

Where indicated in the Catalogue as "Full Tariff ", marking and measurement have been carried out in accordance with Section 4.2 page 69 of the "Forests Mensuration Handbook" using Tariff Tables.

Where indicated in the Catalogue as "Abbreviated Tariff ", marking and measurement have been carried out in accordance with procedures set out Section 4.3 page 88, of the "Forests Mensuration Handbook"

### Sawlogs

Lots 2.01 and 2.03-2.11 will be sold on a price per tonne basis.

Lots 2.02 will be sold for a price per cubic metre underbark. The volume of the timber will be calculated from the weights of the loads supplied converted to volume using volume/weight conversion factors obtained from measurements of the volumes of sample loads on a 1 in 5 basis or any other ratio which may be agreed between the purchaser and seller. The volume of sample loads will be obtained by the methods laid down in Part III of Forestry Commission Booklet 39 "Forest Mensuration Handbook"
