Grizedale Forest is a busy hub offering a variety of unique experiences and activities for visitors. Since the late 1960's Grizedale Forest has been a pioneer of opening up forests as places for visitors to experience, leading the way in recreation and leisure in England's public forests. The unique selling points of the forest are the range of adventurous activities available and the landmark sculpture programme that was founded in 1977 and continues to this day to commission and present the best of art in the environment.

Grizedale's vision: "to provide a consistently high quality visitor experience for the public to enjoy healthy outdoor pursuits in attractive, sustainable and safe environment".

Guided Walks Volunteers work closely with our visitor experience team to provide our visitors with a memorable experience of Grizedale Forest.

In this key role you will provide a warm welcome and build positive rapport with visitors, as well as providing information to help them to make their visit a memorable one. You will interact closely with our visitors by passing on your knowledge and information during the guided walk.

Guided Walks Volunteers have the chance to lead tours of various natures / subjects. These could include child friendly tours, sculpture trail tours, wildlife tours, and more – depending on the volunteers' knowledge and interests.

Through sharing your enthusiasm for the forest you will contribute to visitors leaving Grizedale with a greener heart.

Guided Walks Volunteers will inspire our visitors so that they become enthusiastic about the Forest and become ambassadors for Grizedale.

## What's in it for you?

1. Meet and work with a fun and diverse team who love forests, art, adventure and wildlife
2. Make friends
3. New experiences and a variety of roles to enjoy
4. Potential research opportunities into new material for tours
5. Furthering an interest in local wildlife, local history and art
6. Receive training and the opportunity to learn new skills
7. Free refreshments in a dedicated volunteer common room
8. After 35 volunteering hours get a free annual parking pass, which will be renewed annually subject to hours completed and internal reviews
9. Continuing education opportunities such as guided walks, meet artists, field trips and events
10. A Forestry Commission Volunteer uniform for public facing volunteers
11. Annual recognition events
12. Long service awards

## Key Work Areas:

1. Meet and welcome visitors who are joining the guided walk
2. Ensure all participants are happy with the distance, duration, and fitness level required for the walk
3. Deliver an exciting range of tours for a variety of audiences – e.g. adults and children
4. Promote the important work The Forestry Commission does and in particular how Grizedale improves valuable woodland assets in ways that are good for people, nature and the economy
5. Get to know the on-site partners enabling you to encourage visitors to sample the café, GoApe, shop, Grizedale Mountain Bikes.
6. Interact with our visitors throughout the walk, including answering relevant questions
7. Feedback and Evaluation about the site as a whole
8. Farewell and encourage visitors to return

5. Helpful nature and enjoy being part of a team

8. Are interested in getting involved in research in order to produce a variety of guided walks
9. Knowledge of the forest and local area is useful but this can be learnt

## Training:

Each volunteer opportunity is different - with its own unique set of responsibilities and therefore requiring its own unique mix of relevant training, skills and experience. All new Guided Walks Volunteers will receive an induction and training following successful appointment.

Commit as much or as little time as you wish. It is helpful if you can commit to a regular slot but this could be weekly, monthly etc. The Centre is open 7 days so we would welcome volunteers who can help at weekends as well as mid-week.
