- 🌿 **Environmental Arts and Crafts** (making use of natural materials linked to art and design technology)
- 🌿 **Habitats and Homes** (exploration, identification and self build linked to science and design technology)
- 🌿 **Camouflage and Survival** (colours and requirements for life linked to science and art)
- 🌿 **River Studies** (flow, function and features linked to geography and science)
- 🌿 **Orienteering and trails** (following, setting and map work linked to maths and geography)
- 🌿 **Woodland Myths and Legends** (traditions, stories and crafts linked to literacy, citizenship and history)
- 🌿 **Den Building** (different scales, methods and resources linked to maths and design technology)

Please note admission charges for coaches and minibuses will apply (this includes vehicles that access the forest for setting down as well as those parked for the duration of the visit). The charge is £12 per coach, £8 per minibus or £3 per car and will be invoiced in arrears by Forestry Commission. Money from these charges is used to help maintain the visitor facilities provided on site, such as car parks, toilets, play areas and trails
