To help your day go smoothly and to help with your planning stage, example activity risk assessments and suggested learning objectives are available. We also provide other safety information for the site. Whenever possible on all booked visits, a ranger will meet and welcome your group. This is a chance to meet a new face and someone who works for the Forestry Commission.

For all visits a pre-visit is recommended. This is to ensure you know where you can go, what you will be doing and what resources are available.

These activities are usually placed in backpacks for easy use in the field. The activities have equipment, games and resources for a class of up to 35 children.
