With the world population reaching 7 billion, demands on natural resources are increasing. There is a clear need to effectively reuse land to cope with the forever increasing need for living and working space.

Previously used land or brownfields have the potential for delivering useful combinations of services and hence new opportunities. These include housing not only for development but also to provide efficient water management, energy sources, improved ecosystem and conservation services, and wider societal benefits, in order to meet other challenges such as adapting to climate change and urban regeneration. Achieving this potential will need an intelligent and holistic suite of technologies, management measures and land use.

This workshop will:

- explore the different options for unlocking the potential of brownfield sites
- highlight the different funding mechanisms for the various options
- draw on the findings of several major European projects such as the GREENLAND and HOMBRE projects
- demonstrate good practice through case studies

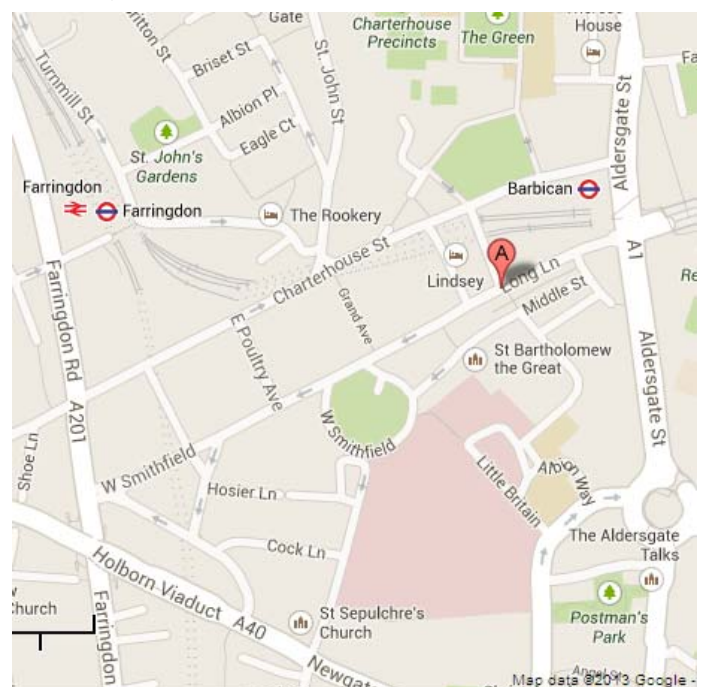
