# Rhododendron removal from woodlands in Cornwall, Devon, Exmoor and in the vicinity of *Phytophthora ramorum*

**Introduction** This leaflet provides guidance on how to apply for this regionally focused grant. It supplements the generic guidance on Woodland Improvement Grant, which is available from the [EWGS website](#).

**Background** The Peninsula's ancient and native woodlands are quintessential features of its much loved landscape, providing irreplaceable habitats for a range of woodland species as well as opportunities for producing timber and a place for quiet recreation.

Rhododendron represents a threat to the long term health and survival of our ancient and other woodlands and there are dense areas in the Peninsula. Where it occurs in high densities it alters the nature of the wood and prevents natural processes of woodland regeneration from happening. Rhododendron also acts as a host for *Phytophthora ramorum* which represents a serious threat to the long term survival of our woodlands.

**Eligibility** In order to be eligible for this grant applicants must meet the following:

- The general criteria and conditions for Woodland Improvement Grant (WIG) apply – refer to the [WIG guidance](#) for further details
- This grant is available for the removal of rhododendron from woodlands in Cornwall, Devon, Greater Exmoor, and over the rest of the region where Rhododendron occurs within 3 kilometres of a confirmed infection of *Phytophthora* spp on trees. This grant does not cover Natural England and Defence Estates owned woodlands, and Rhododendron infected with *Phytophthora* spp.
- The objectives of this grant are outcome focused so rhododendron will be completely removed from areas covered by the agreement. Initial clearance and subsequent follow up spraying operations will be agreed and incorporated into one agreement.

**Payment** An 80% contribution will be offered towards the standard costs in the table below. The codes in blue should be used to refer to each operation on your application.

When applying for this grant you should email a completed copy of the “WIG Calculator” which is available for download from [www.forestry.gov.uk/ewgs-wig](http://www.forestry.gov.uk/ewgs-wig), or complete the paper form EWGS 5. When filling in the WIG calculator, enter the appropriate code e.g. “X2” and it will automatically start to fill in the operation details
