Background Information

The Forestry Commission work in partnership with Nottinghamshire County Council to be able to provide placements for individuals with an interest in pursuing a career in the outdoor or environmental sector. The Sherwood Bushcraft Shadow Ranger placement would suit those wanting to gain experience in leading bushcraft activity sessions to groups of all ages and abilities.

Successful applicants will be given training and development opportunities by work shadowing the Sherwood Bushcraft team. They will develop on the job skills; including development of bushcraft techniques, leading and working with groups and planning and running events.

Unfortunately at the present time we **cannot** offer travel expenses however we do provide extensive experience and some formal training opportunities.

Purpose of the Apprenticeship

Working as part of the Sherwood Bushcraft team to deliver key Forestry Commission messages through the Sherwood Bushcraft programme. To gain experience of delivering bushcraft, traditional woodland skills and team building activities to a wide range of audiences at Sherwood Pines. Engage with people of all ages and abilities and inspire them to enjoy and appreciate the forest and their outdoor environment. Support delivery of activities and events to people from a variety of social backgrounds. Experience the range of tasks, activities and procedures that rangers undertake within their role.

However, the Forestry Commission is willing to consider any proposal put forward by applicants that would allow them to do the job by other means.
