Background Information

Sherwood and Northants Forest District is part of Forest Enterprise, an Agency of the Forestry Commission, and we manage 21,627 ha of the Public Forest Estate on behalf of the Government.

We are looking for individuals with an interest in pursuing a career in bushcraft/survival skills, working with young people, environmental education or recreation and wanting to gain experience in the sector. Successful applicants will be given training and development opportunities by work shadowing current environmental education staff.

They will shadow staff and develop on the job skills; including development of bushcraft techniques, leading and working with groups of young people of all abilities, planning and undertaking events, and assisting with environmental education.

Unfortunately at the present time we **cannot** offer travel expenses however we do provide extensive experience and some formal training opportunities.

Purpose of the Apprenticeship

Experience and encourage active involvement of young people in the art of bushcraft, team building and environmental education at Sherwood Pines Forest Park. Engage with all ages and abilities to inspire them to enjoy and appreciate their outdoor environment; through ranger-led sessions, practical projects, activities and events.

Working as part of the Education Ranger team assist, support and help inspire groups to become actively involved and enjoy their woodland. Assist and provide support to a diverse range of people, experiencing the range of tasks, activities and procedures that rangers undertake within their role.

However, the Forestry Commission is willing to consider any proposal put forward by applicants that would allow them to do the job by other means.
