## **SUMMARY**

This report provides results from a cycling survey that took place in Sherwood Pines Forest Park. A total of 60 questionnaires were completed, 8 on weekdays and 52 at the weekend.

40% of the groups consisted of 2 people, with a further 22% of groups consisting of 4 people. 74% of groups included adults aged between 25-59 years, 45% included senior citizens, 7% included young adults aged 16-24 years, and 36% of groups included children.

25% of respondents had travelled between 6-15 miles to reach the site. 22% had travelled between 16 and 25 miles.

53% of respondents had visited the site before. Of those who had visited the woodland before, 41% visited between 1 and 3 times a year. 40% visited less often and a further 12% visited between 1 and 3 times a month.

35% had always known about the woodland. 21% found out through friends and relatives. A further 15% found out through local guide book/map.

23% of respondents at the woodland were visiting for fresh air/exercise. 22% of respondents were visiting the sites to walk (with or without dogs).

41% of respondents were staying at the woodland for around 4 hours plus.

98% of respondents said they would go to the visitor centre again.

Most of the respondents expressed an opinion about the lay out, opening hours, range of products and the standard of service in the shop. They were all generally rated good.

## SHERWOOD PINES CYCLING SURVEY 2000

A total of 60 interviews were carried out, 8 on weekdays and 52 at the weekend.

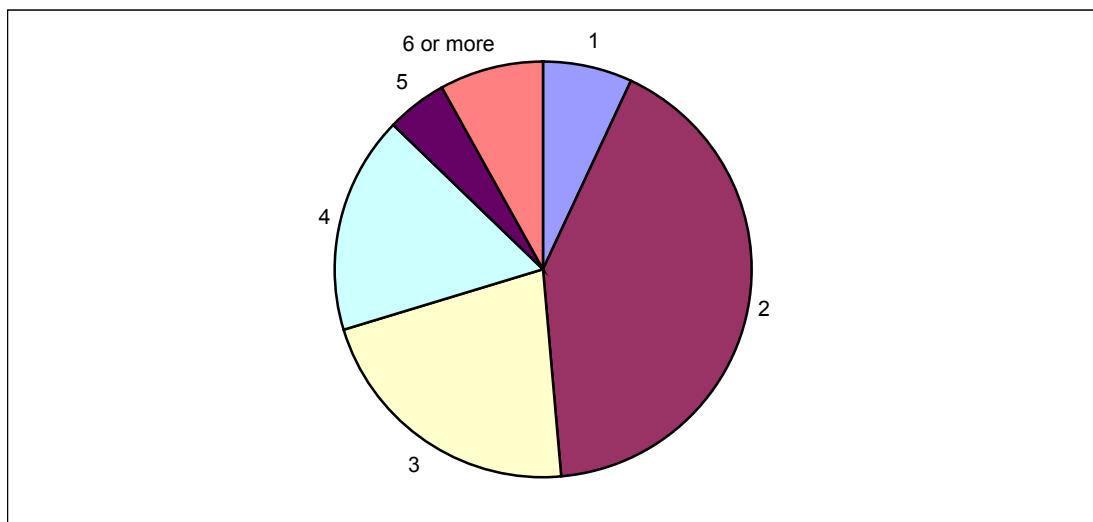
### Group Composition

There were a total of 184 visitors in the 60 groups interviewed. There were roughly equal numbers of male and female visitors.

42% of groups included 2 people, and 22% consisted of 3 people. 17% of groups consisted of 4 people.

Excluding groups of 10 or more, there were on average 3.1 people per group.

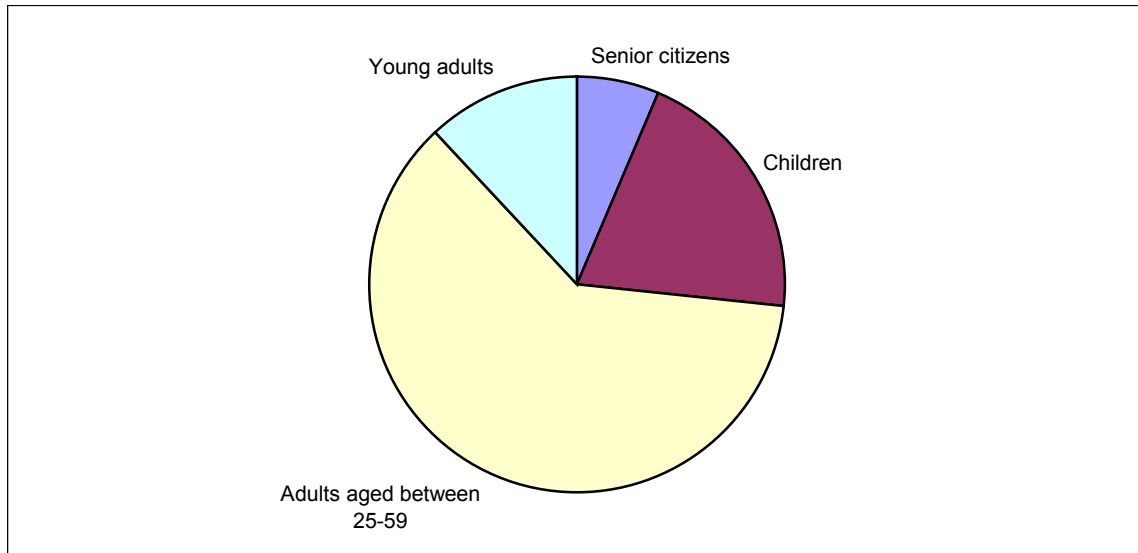
**Figure 1.1: Group Size**



The majority of groups (83%) included adults aged between 25-59 years, and 12% included at least one senior citizen. 18% of groups included young adults and 40% included children.

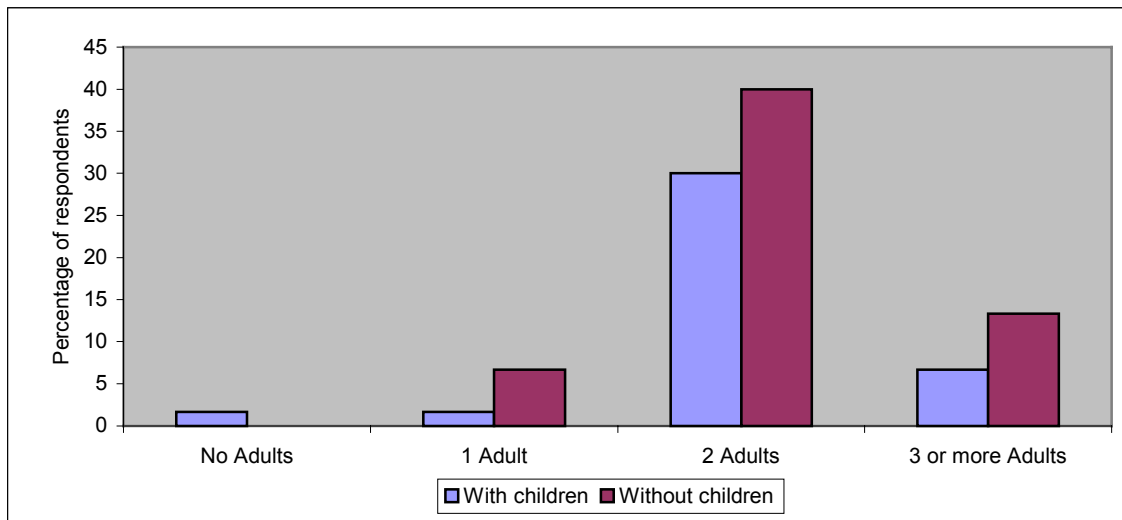
In terms of total visitors, adults aged between 25-59 years accounted for 61% of all visitors. 20% of all visitors were children, and 12% were young adults.

40% of groups included two adults and no children, and 30% included two adults with children.

**Figure 1.3: Type of Group**

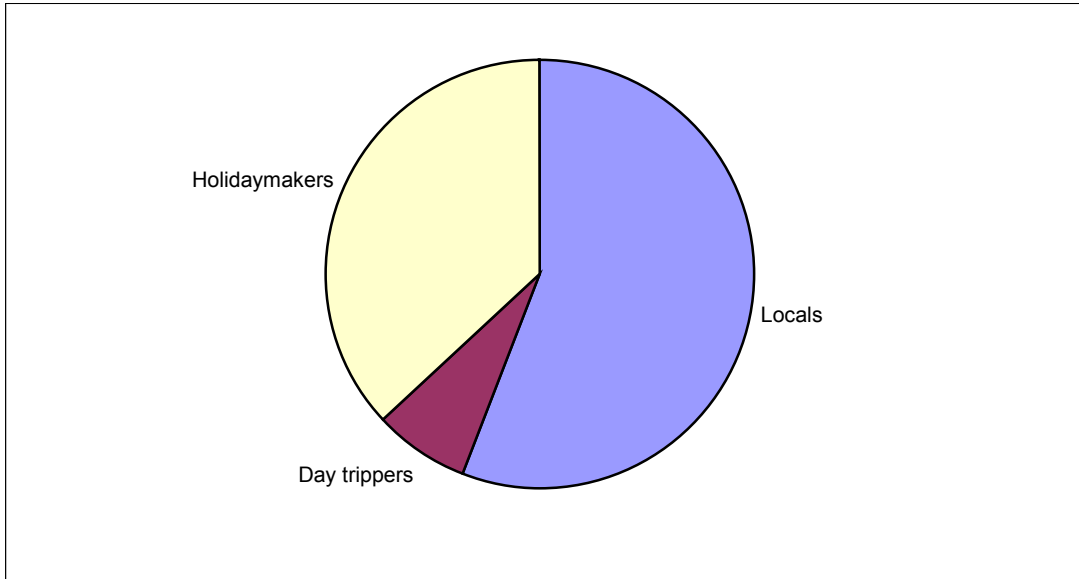




## Type of Visitor

56% of visitors were locals (living within 15 miles of the site). 37% of visitors were holidaymakers. 7% were on a day trip from home.

## Visitor Profile

All of those interviewed were asked to provide their full home postcode.

Each of these postcodes was assigned an “ACORN” code. The Acorn classification was created using cluster analysis of the 1991 Population Census to divide almost all postcodes in 54 “types”. These types can be aggregated into 17 “groups” and the groups into 6 broad “categories” (A to F). Addresses in postcodes within any “type” will therefore tend to have a lot in common and can be given a label which describes the typical member of that “type”, e.g. “Wealthy suburbs, large detached houses”.

The acorn codes are reassigned each year to represent demographic changes since 1991.

The table below shows the proportion of valid postcodes from the survey that fall into each group. This is then compared to the overall GB population using an index, to look for similarities and differences between the two.

The table shows that the level of visits to Sherwood were highest among ‘Well-off Workers, Family Areas’ (B5) and ‘Comfortable Middle Agers, Mature Home Owning Areas’ (D9).

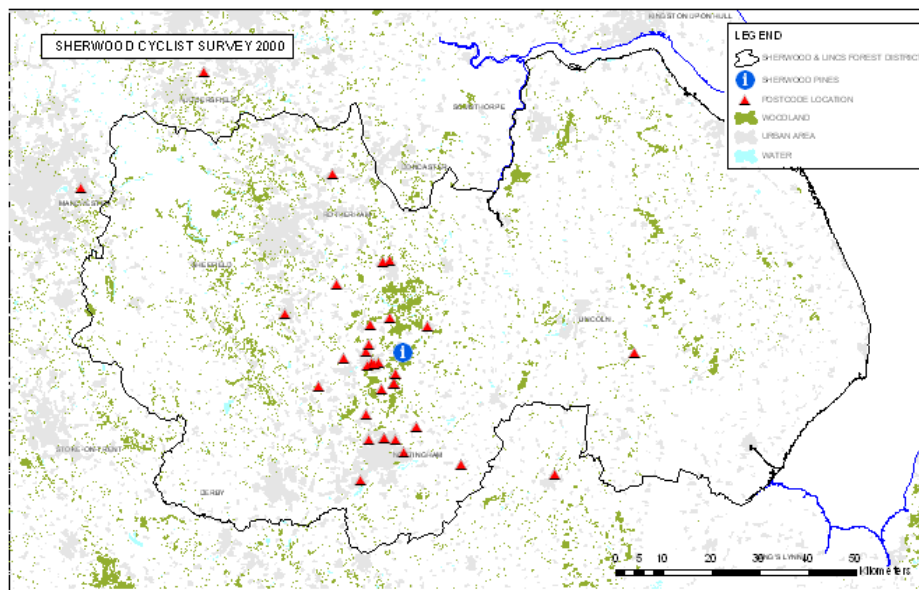
## Visitor Origin

All those interviewed were asked to provide their full postcode. Table 1.3 shows the origin of visitors, based on the home postcodes and town/country names supplied.

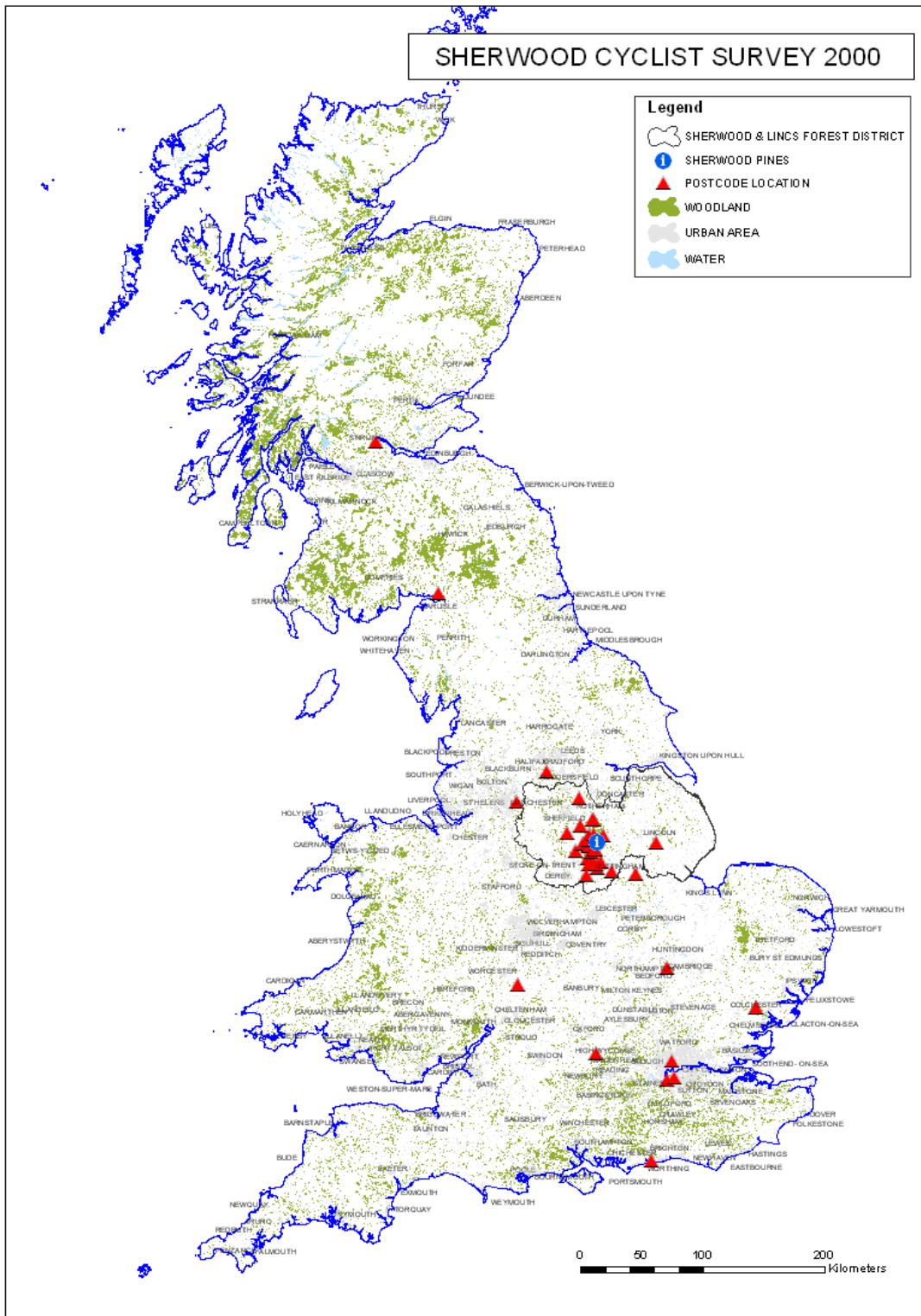

**Figure 1: Map indicating the origin of Visitors to Sherwood Pines in the local area**

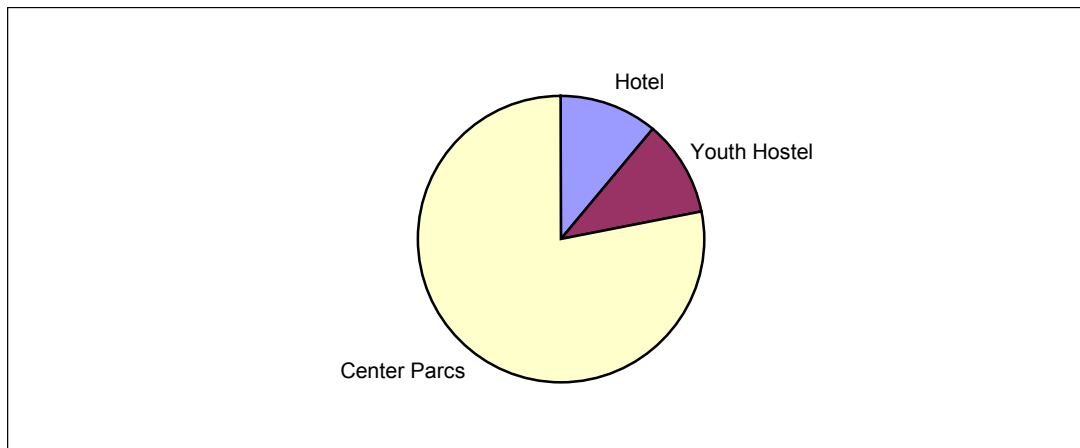


**Figure 2: Map indicating the origin of visitors to Sherwood Pines and giving a valid postcode in GB**

79% of respondents stayed at Centre Parcs. 11% of respondents stayed at a hotel and a further 10% stayed at a youth hostel.

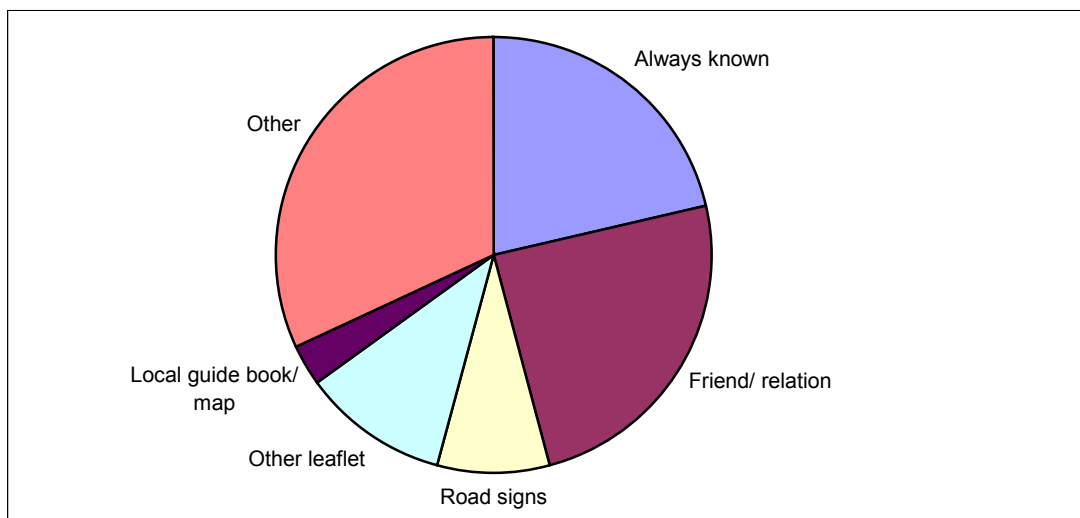
**Figure 2: Type of Accommodation**



### Finding out about the site

21% of all respondents had always known about the woodland. 24% found out through friends or relatives. A further 30% of respondents found out through other methods, mainly through Centre Parcs.

The table below shows that the majority of repeat visitors had always known about the site, or had found out through other Centre Parcs. 28% of first time visitors had found out about the site through friends or relatives, and a further 39% through other methods (mainly through Centre Parcs).

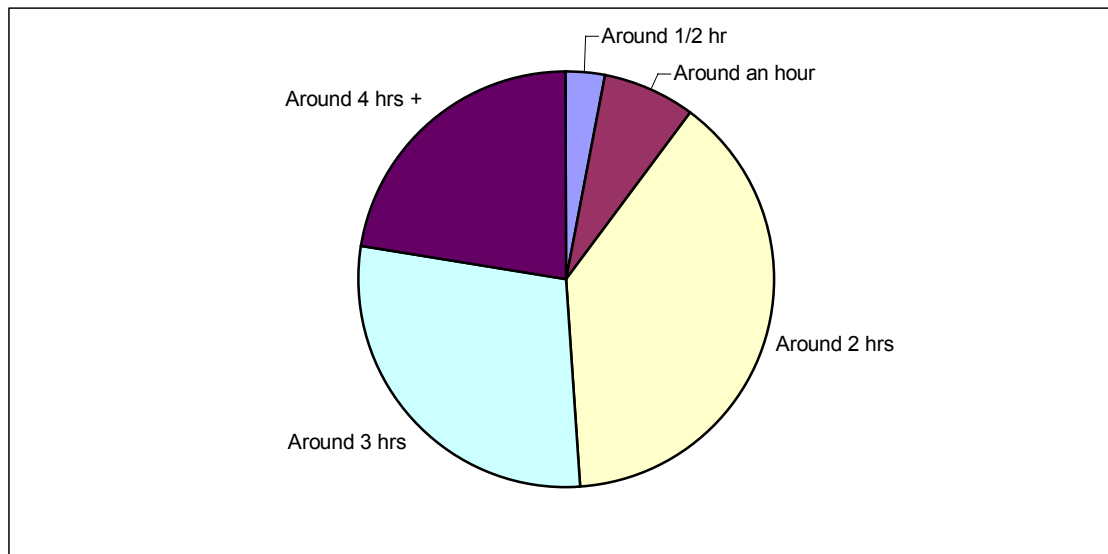

### Length of Stay

39% of respondents were staying at the woodland for around 2 hours. 29% were staying for around 3 hours and 22% were staying around 4 hours plus.

The average length of stay at the woodland was 2.7 hours.

## Cycling

The results below present the ratings in terms of proportion of visitors who expressed an opinion.

23% of respondents cycle for leisure more than once a week in the summer. 23% of respondents cycle for leisure twice a month.

19% of respondents said they cycled in Sherwood once a week in the summer, a further 36% of respondents said they never cycled in Sherwood in the summer.

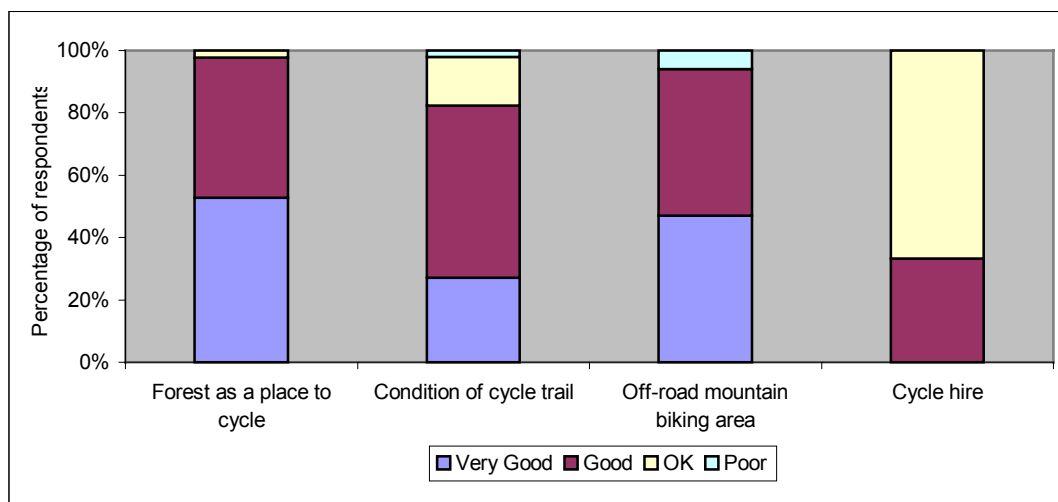
78% expressed an opinion about the forest as a place to cycle. Of those 98% rated it as good or very good.

81% of respondents used the cycle trail. Of these 83% rated it as good or very good.

29% of respondents used the off-road mountain biking area. Of these 94% rated it as good or very good.

7% of respondents hired bikes from VC. Of these 33% rated the cycle hire facility as good.

**Figure 5: Cycle ratings**



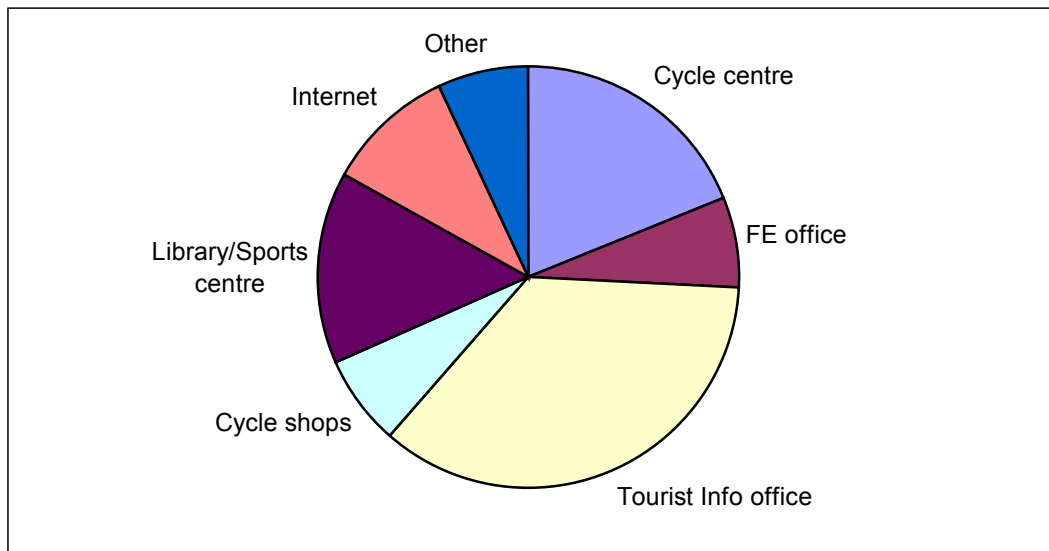
53% of respondents said they did no cycling “off the trail” or in the “mountain biking area”, 24% did all their cycling off the road.

92% of respondents thought there were adequate facilities for cyclists at the woodland.

31% of respondents were aware of the forest cycling code.

36% of respondents expected to find the information regarding cycling at the tourist information office. A further 19% expected to find the information regarding cycling at the cycle centre.

### **Possible Improvements**

The most popular suggestions were to improve bike storage, first aid and rain shelters. Other suggestions were family routes and better signage.

### **Attraction of the forest**

The proximity of Centre Parc was one of the attractions of the forest. Other attractions of the woodland were the safety and fun for children.
