



Where in the World Teacher's Notes KS1

Follow our Where in the World trail map to discover Westonbirt Arboretum's "Amazing Trees from Around the World". Each tree has a wooden portrait shaped board next to it with information about the tree so you will know when you have found it. Take your class on a journey around the globe!



Before you come:

- Print "Where in the World" KS1 maps – we suggest one map per adult helper group
- Create the passports – you will need one cover per pupil and 7 bark rubbing pages or 7 drawing pages per pupil.
- Bring crayons if you want to do bark rubbings
- Bring pencils
- Bring a camera
- Print off the flags and tree names one sided - we recommend putting them into polythene pockets
- Bring an inflatable globe if you want to look at the country at each tree
- We recommend a pre-visit to orientate yourself if you are unfamiliar with the site.

At each tree:

- Write down the name of the tree on the world map.
- Allow time for each child to complete a bark rubbing or a drawing of the tree (depending on which activity you prefer) in their passport.





- Find the correct tree name and flag and take a quick class photo in front of the tree holding the name and flag aloft. This will make it much easier when you get back to school to remember which tree was which!
- If you've brought a globe, look for the country that the tree would normally grow.
- Why not give each tree a hug?



Back at School:

- Why not create a display of your trip around the world with the photos you have taken?
- Use photos as a starting point for discussion. Which was the children's favourite tree? What similarities and differences were there between the trees you visited?
- Look at the countries on the globe and find out more about where the trees come from.
