- Overall, the number of installations and interest in biomass continues to grow apace, with enquiries to Heartwoods rising and an ever increasing interest in fuel supply
- The Heartwoods website has comprehensive info on woodfuel

Wood fuel Challenge - Wyre Wood fuel pathfinder - Phase 1

- The pathfinder is due to finish by April 09, but has delivered 10 trained Woodfuel Champions, 12 advisory visits and 3 installation feasibility studies, with more to come
- one of Wills key tasks will be to evaluate the pathfinder and feed the lessons back to the wider region
- we had a display at the recent Grow With Wyre event which generated interest and contacts
- we expect to hold a final 'training'/networking event in April to feed back the findings and prepare for Grow With Wyre
- Forest Research has continued the Wyre woodfuel harvesting trials the
 production costs for the coppice material in the first trial were very high
 suggesting coppice for fuel only as a by product of e.g. biodiversity funded
 work
- The pathfinder experience is a pilot for the regional RDPE project

WMids AONBs Wood for Heat project

- Target of 8 feasibility studies for owner supplied wood heat installations in Shropshire Hills and Malvern Hills AONB – 4 studies so far
- These will drive management of woodland and non-woodland trees within these protected areas and extend the pool of woodfuel 'champions' by tying in with the pathfinder

RDPE – WM Woodfuel Supply Chain

- Further delayed due to queries on project structure and financing
- FC hope to pick up accountable body role
- Estimated project start has unfortunately now been put back to summer 09
- In the meantime we hope to maintain momentum by using a small underspend from the Wyre pathfinder to continue to build capacity in the supply chain

Wood Energy Task Group

- Andy Grundy has agreed to continue as chair for the time-being
- Arranging a meeting has been delayed due to delay on RDPE but we hope to arrange a meeting in the next couple of months

Warwickshire Producer Group

 Congratulations to Zoe Bell and colleagues at Godfrey Payton for securing funding from Defra under the recent Bioenergy Infrastructure grant to set up a producer group in Warwickshire – Heartwoods supported the application
