The workshop entitled 'Wood Fuel Heating Systems – A Practical Guide' has been run successfully with funding through the Bioenergy WM Initiative at Harper Adams University College during 2009. The College are now pleased to announce that it will be running a fifth practical workshop on Wood Fuel Heating Systems on 27th April 2010 in conjunction with Black and Veatch Limited.

It will introduce businesses and organisations to a practical approach to assist with the decision as to whether or not to install a biomass based system.
