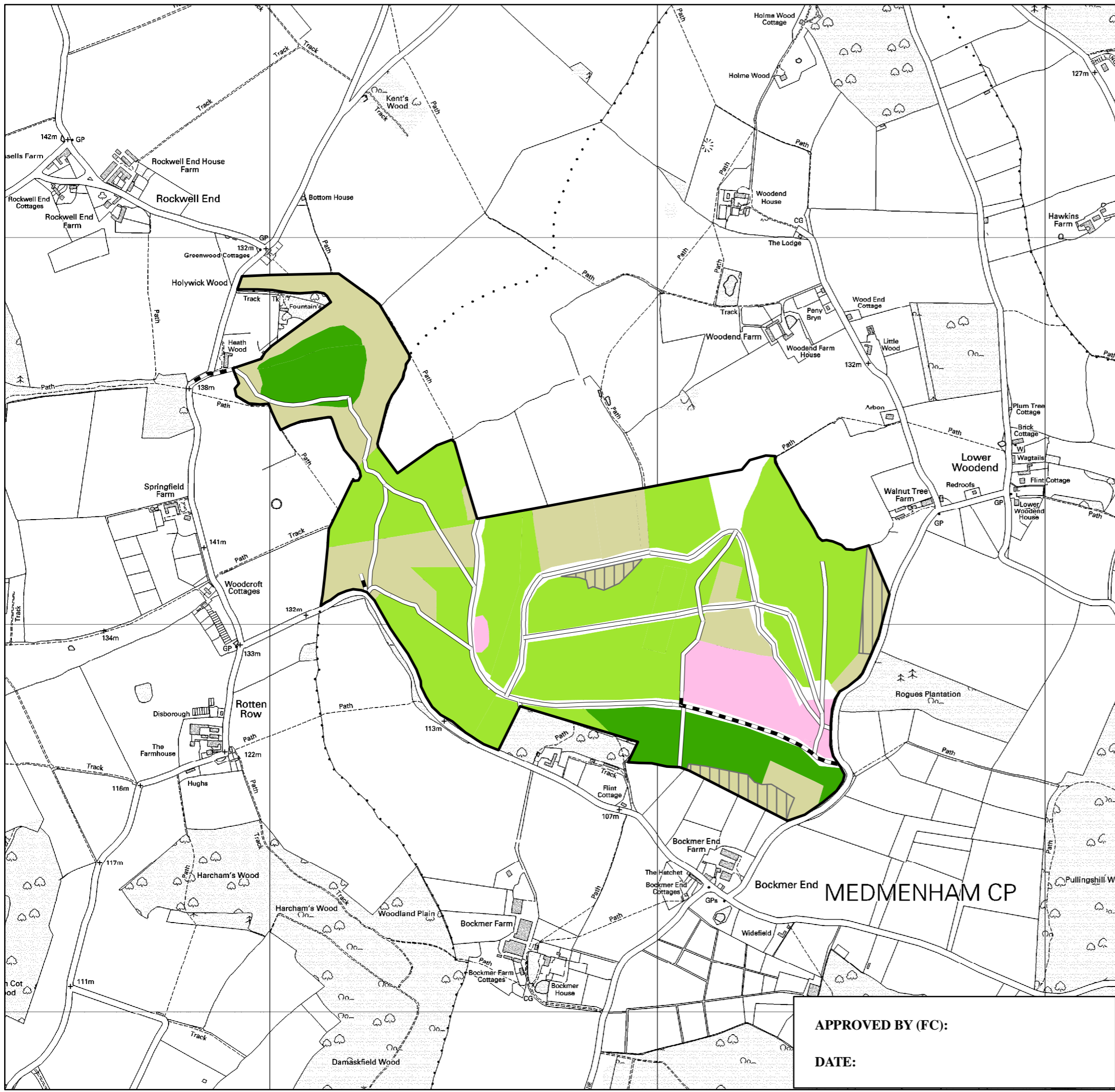

*Indicative of the structure of the woodlands  
at the end of the plan period (2036)*



-  Native broadleaf woodland with a diverse age and species structure.
-  Broadleaf coppice managed on a rotation.
-  Open woodland areas (20-80% canopy cover) managed for amenity, landscape or conservation value.
-  Conifer woodland.
-  Native broadleaf woodland with scattered conifer trees for potential raptor nesting sites.
-  Native broadleaf species regenerating amongst and replacing existing conifer woodland or colonising cleared areas.
-  Native broadleaf woodland of high biodiversity or amenity value, benefiting from limited intervention.
-  Permanent open space with scattered trees (<20% canopy cover).

-  Rides and tracks
-  Watercourse
