

Festive forest fun!

Grab some sticks and get creative this Christmas!

Make a seasonal woodland star.

Step 1 - Come to the forest and find some sticks

Step 2 - Separate the sticks into five small bundles

Step 3 - Using elastic bands bind two bundles together to make a V shape.
Repeat this with two more bundles.

Step 4 - Fit the last bundle in place to complete your fabulous woodland star!

Make a woodland window decoration.

Come to the forest and find a nice leaf and two small sticks.

Glue some tissue paper to the sticks and glue the leaf in place.

Add another layer of tissue paper on top to sandwich the leaf.

Varnish the tissue paper with a mix of PVA glue and water, leave this to dry and then hang in front of a Christmas light or in a window.

Grab some pine cones and get creative this Christmas!



Christmas Angel

Come to the forest and find a pine cone.

For the head you'll need to find a face shaped seed or nut. Acorns, conkers and hazelnuts all work well and if you look hard you can find them on the forest floor.

Paint the pine cone, white or silver paint is ideal.

Whilst the paint is still wet, sprinkle with glitter.

Make and decorate wings using card, paint and glitter.

Once the paint is dry, use a dab of glue to attach the head, body and wings together.

A glitter pipe cleaner makes a great halo and you could use cotton wool for hair.



Christmas Tree

Find a pine cone from the forest floor.

Paint the pine cone green. Whilst the paint is still wet, sprinkle with glitter.

Once dry, use a dab of glue to attach a disk to your pine cone so that your tree will stand up. We have used a disk of wood, but thick card would work well too.

Use cotton wool to give a snow effect and glitter pipe cleaners for your tinsel.
