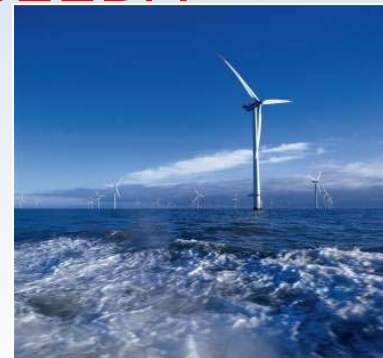

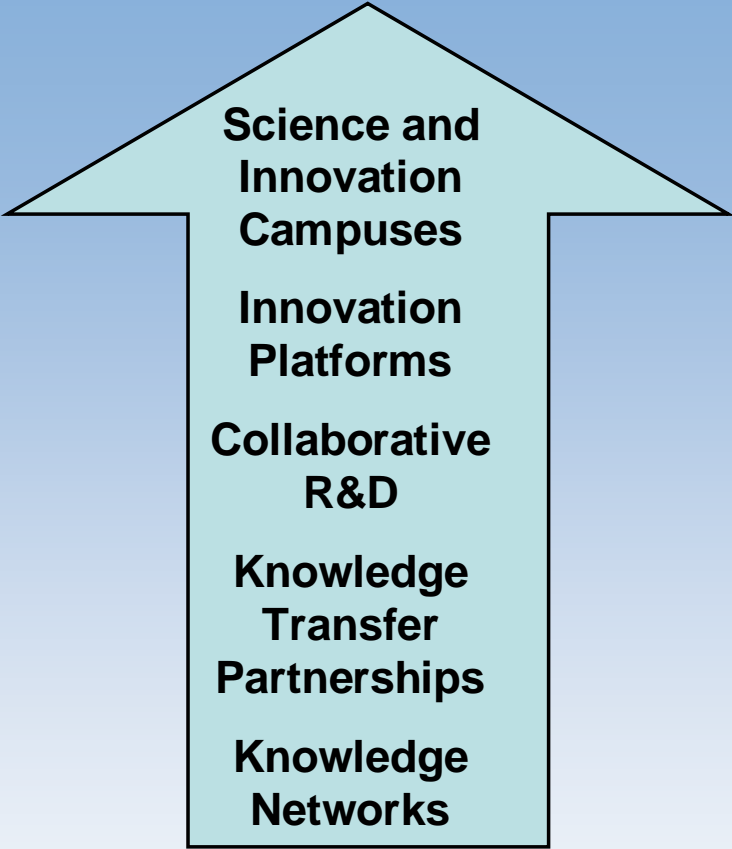

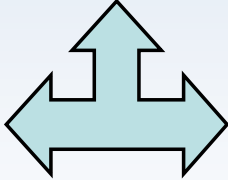

Centre of excellence enabling collaborative working and research to develop, test and demonstrate solutions for

## **Integrated Management of Resources for Communities and Districts**

- Part of an **international network** giving access to world class knowledge in sustainability
- Provide a place where academics and business people can **work together** on both research and demonstration
- **Shorten the lead time** for implementing new technologies in live developments
- Focus on **systems integration and development**, to obtain an order of magnitude enhancement of impact
- **Demonstrator** site will provide a test bed for integrating current best practice technologies into large and complex systems
- Linked to Dagenham Dock IfS and Dongtan IfS
  
- Opportunities: rural-urban interface; future-proofing; waste; energy; water.

# Innovation Platform - Low Impact Housing

- The UK construction industry is around £100bn in size (8% of GDP) and employs 2.1 million people
- UK construction sales are split roughly equally between new build, and repairs, maintenance and improvement
- About a third of all UK construction is directly procured by the public sector
- Global construction activity accounts for 10% of the world economy and 25% of all raw materials
- The CLG Code for Sustainable Homes will require all new housing to use 44% less energy by 2014, and to be 'zero net carbon' by 2017



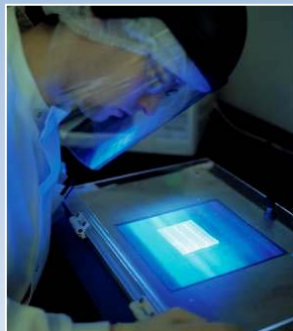
# How are Innovation Platforms organised?

- Each Innovation Platform has a Steering Group
  - Representatives from the Government Department that owns the “challenge”
  - A Research Council member who represents all the Research Councils
  - A Regional Development Agency member who represents all the Regional Development Agencies and Devolved Administrations
  - A lead Knowledge Transfer Network representative who represents all KTNs
  - A cross section of businesses, with senior representation
  - The Innovation Platform staff
