

SHADOW RANGER VOLUNTARY WORK PLACEMENT

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Local labour market information has highlighted a shortage of conservation recruits with a practical background of relevant work experience.

We are looking for **individuals with an interest in pursuing a career in countryside management.** Successful applicants will be given training and development opportunities by work shadowing current countryside management staff.

They will develop on the job skills and experience, including practical site management (incl. habitat creation and restoration); working with communities (capacity building, project development and implementation); planning and undertaking countryside events; and environmental education.

Unfortunately at the present time, we cannot offer travel expenses, however we do provide an extensive range of informal and formal training.

SHADOW RANGER PLACEMENTS

The placement will be bespoke and flexible to suit individual needs, but is likely to be 1 - 3 days a week for a six month period.

Sherwood Forest Community Rangers (Forestry Commission) co-ordinates the partnership between Forestry Commission, (Nottinghamshire, Lincolnshire & South Yorkshire), Nottinghamshire County Council, Nottinghamshire Wildlife Trust and Greenwood Community Forest. The Shadow Ranger Placement provides each trainee with a mentor and we have opportunities for 3-5 placements within the above organisations.
