













South East England Whiteley Pastures

Design Concept

Illustrates the main features and broad character of the woodland in 30 years time.

-  Management area
-  Native woodland with scattered conifer that has been retained for diversity of habitat and landscape interest.
-  Native woodland beneath powerline is coppiced on a cycle to provide cyclical open and scrub habitat for Nightingale and reptiles.
-  Young native woodland has established on this ancient woodland site where conifer once grew.
-  Native wet woodland supports insect, bat & bird populations associated with this habitat.
-  Well maintained paths encourage people to use and enjoy the woodland for leisure and healthy living.
-  Network of grassy tracks provides lowland meadow habitat and encourages people to enjoy the woodland.
-  Grassy tracks
-  Forest road
-  Overhead powerline
-  Watercourse
-  Pond
