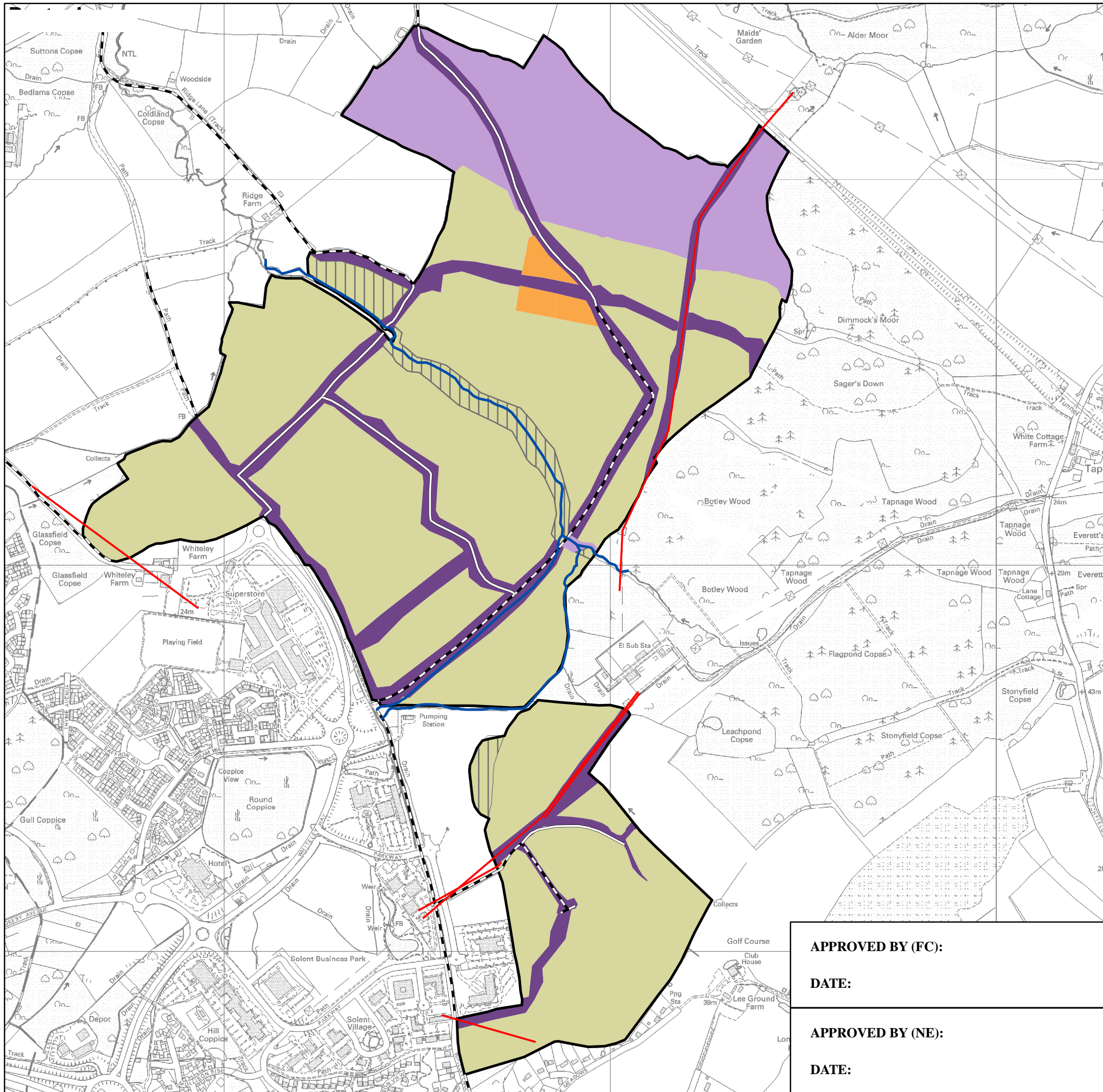

Future Habitats Map



-  Predominantly native woodland with a small element of conifer (<5%). Small patches of open space support early successional vegetation during the establishment of young native trees.
-  Predominantly native woodland with pockets of Natural Reserve wet woodland habitat.
-  Native broadleaf wet woodland (Natural Reserve).
-  Hazel coppiced on a cycle provides cyclical open space with early successional vegetation during the regrowth phase of the coppice stools.
-  Permanent network of open habitat supports invertebrate species. These environmental corridors measure 10-40 metres in width and link up with open habitat on neighbouring land.
-  Forest road
-  Forest access tracks
-  Watercourse
-  Overhead powerline
