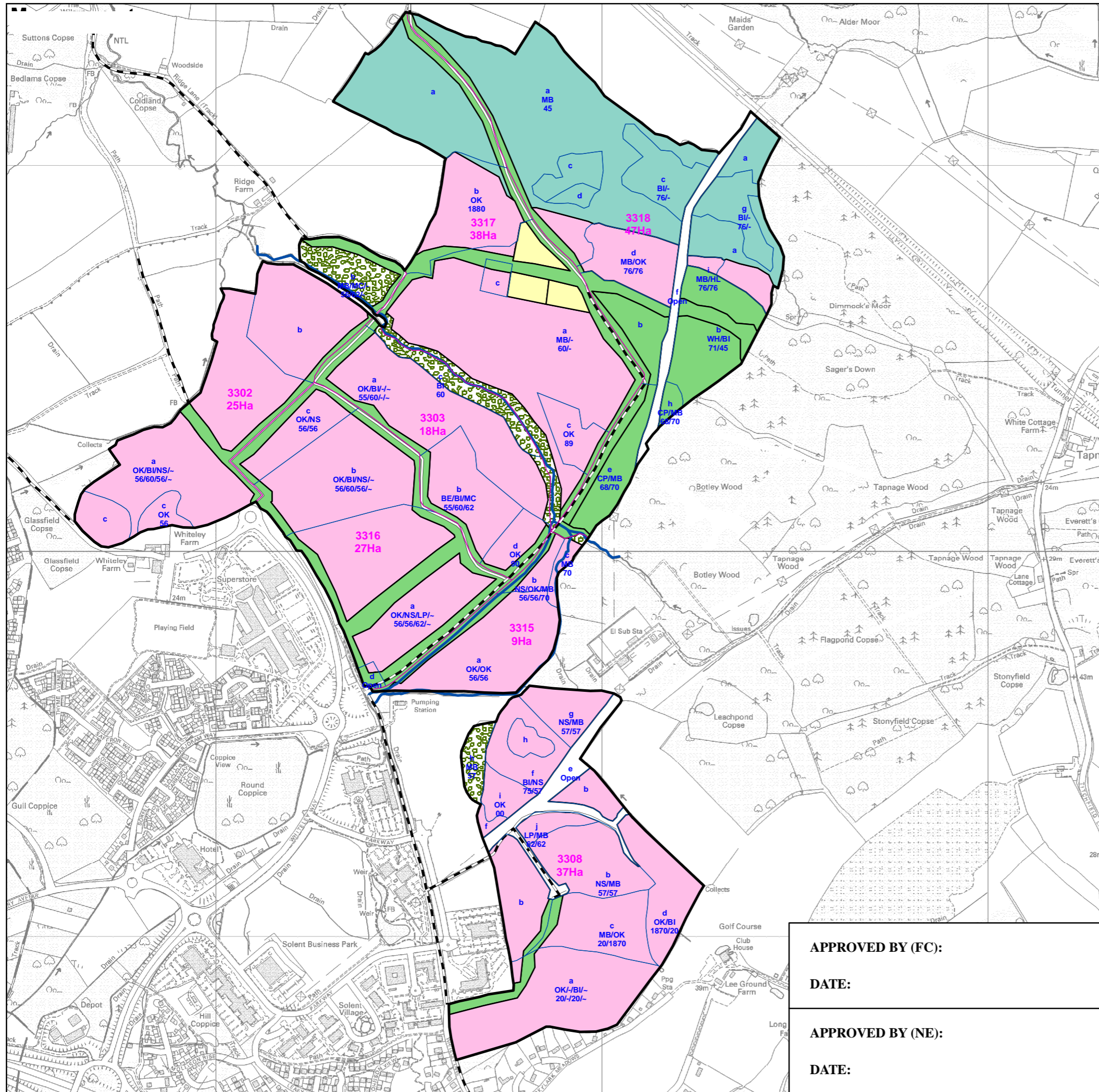






Habitat Restoration and Felling Map



-  Manage native broadleaf woodland using a Shelterwood System to allow young native broadleaf trees to become established under the shelter of existing trees. Gradually remove any conifer over the next 20 years in a series of operations.
-  Manage native broadleaf woodland containing pockets of wet woodland using a Shelterwood System to allow young native trees to become established under the shelter of existing trees. Leave pockets of wet woodland as Natural Reserves.
-  Clearfell 2007-2011.
-  Minimum intervention wet woodland (Natural Reserve).
-  Coppice woodland on a rotation.
-  Existing open space.
-  Open water
-  Compartments
-  Sub-compartments
-  Forest road
-  Forest access tracks
-  Watercourse
